French Nun, First To Found Women's Labor Unions, Dead

Paris, March 23.—Sister Milcent, a religious of Saint Vincent de Paul, who was the first to found labor organizations for French women, twenty-five years ago, has just died here. She devoted herself with indefatigable ardor to the development of these professional groups here and to the struggle against the exploitation of which domestic workers are too often the victims.

Msgr. P. W. Dunne, Chicago Priest, Dies

Chicago, March 21.—Funeral services were held this morning for the Rt. Rev. Msgr. Patrick W. Dunne, irreverent rector of St. James' Church here, who died Friday at the age of 76, after an illness of more than a week. He had been pastor of St. James' for 16 years.

Sister Serving 62 Years In Hospital Gets French Medal

Paris, March 21.—The mayor of Quimper, in Brittany, acting for the French government has presented the gold medal for public assistance to Sister Marie de la Salette, superior of the hospital of the town. The venerable religious, now 89 years old, has labored at the hospital for 62 years, and for exactly 50 years as superior. In 1886, President Felix Faure, in person, presented Sister Marie de la Salette with a gold medal in recognition of her service.
