Customary Of First Daystown, Ohio, Church Celebrated

Daystown, O., May 30.—Arrival of the first Catholics in this section 100 years ago was commemorated here today. The Rt. Rev. Joseph Schmitt, Bishop of Cleveland, celebrated Pontifical High Mass in St. Peter and Paul Church and delivered the sermon. Several thousand persons came from various points in the diocese to attend the ceremonies.

Ohio, St. John's of Canton, and St. Philip of Neri, of Dugannon, more than a year ago observed the centenary of their founding.

Pioneers in the faith here were a family named Whitman who came in a covered wagon from Pennsylvania. The first church was also structure and Indians were neighbors of the early arrivals. Dominicans, Jesuits, Redemptorists were pioneer ministers to the faithful.

New York Y. W. C. A. Seeks To Change Membership Basis

Aviator Coll Deeply Religious, His Mother Says

Paris, June 1.—To a journalist who went to interview the mother of Francois Coll in Marseilles, the bereaved woman insisted on the deep religious sentiment of her son who accompanied Nungesser in his attempt to fly across the Atlantic. Coll, she recalls, said to her before he left:

"I ask you especially, dear Mother, to pray for me, because your prayers protected me during the war and have always brought me good fortune. Ever since Francois has been in aviation, Mme. Coll went on, and has been exposed to so many dangers, I have never missed a week going up to implore the aid of Notre Dame de la Garde, patroness of Marseilles."

The mother of the aviator praised her son very highly, saying that he had always been daring, fond of unusual enterprises, with no thought of the danger involved. Since school where he had shown brilliant ability, he had not ceased to profess his religious sentiments publicly. This won him the particular esteem of the Bishop of Toulon, who had recently sent him a photograph with a very fatherly inscription.

Mgr. Jas. E. Walsh Consecrated Bishop On Sancian Island

San Francisco, Calif., June 1.—The Rt. Rev. James Edward Walsh, A. P. M., the first native American Bishop in China, was solemnly consecrated recently on Sancian Island, China, according to word received here. Sancian Island is where St. Francis Xavier died.

Bishop Walsh, who is of Cumberland, Maryland, was in the first group of Maryknoll priests to go to China in 1919. He passed through this city enroute. Bishop Walsh is no relation to the Rev. James Anthony Walsh, founder and Superior of Maryknoll.

Priest Dies In Lake Attempting To Save Girl From Drowning

Santa Fe, N. Mex., May 30.—In a futile effort to save the life of a little girl pupil of Loreto Academy, the Rev. Eligius Kunkel, O. F. M., rector of the Cathedral of St. Francisco De Asis, here, was drowned today in Catron Lake, near this city, while several hundred parochial school children on a Memorial Day picnic looked on.

Kilkenny Cat To Be Notre Dame Team's New Mascot

It is believed that this is the first time that this animal has been the mascot of a university or college.

Strasbourg Forbids Children Under 16 At Certain Movies

Paris, June 1.—The prefect of Strasbourg has signed an order which is intended to protect children from the dangers of evil motion pictures. According to this order, children of less than 16 years, even when accompanied by older persons, are to be admitted only to "movies" for children and adolescents. Children under seven years are to be excluded from all motion picture theaters.

Films which show scenes of violence and all that might have a bad influence on the morals of children may not form part of a program for children and adolescents. If only one scene in a film is condemned, it is to be cut. Should the manager refuse to do this, the entire film will be rejected.

Hospital Erected For Big Convention Is Milwaukee Idea

Chartres to Have Notable Centennial Celebration In Blessed Virgin's Honor

Paris, France.—Magnificent celebrations in honor of the Blessed Virgin which will be attended by the Nuncio, forty cardinals, archbishops and bishops, among them the Archbishop of Quebec, and several abbots of famous monasteries, will take place in the Cathedral of Chartres from May 31 to June 6. They will mark the ninth centenary of the foundation of the crypt in which is venerated a famous statue of the Blessed Virgin.

The crypt is one of the largest in the world—its length is 721 feet—and was built on the site of the oldest sanctuary of the world dedicated to the Blessed Virgin Mary. Even before the birth of Christ, Gallic priests, called Druids, venerated on this spot, a wooden statue quite rudely carved to represent a woman seated, with her eyes closed and holding her child on her knees. This statue was called Virgo Paritura—the virgin who is to give birth to a child. When the first disciples of the apostles came to evangelize the country, they recognized that this woman was Mary, the Mother of God, and without delay, the go-to where the sacred image stood became a church in honor of the Blessed Virgin. The cult of the Virgin Mary took on such breadth that an old proverb says of Chartres: "Carum est ubi omnia Mariam sonant"—"Chartres, where everything speaks of Mary."
