Detroit, June 7.—Sister Mary Olympia, superior of Providence Hospital here for the last 15 years, has gone to St. Mary and Margaret Hospital, Dorchester, Mass., where she will take up new duties. Sister Olympia expanded Providence Hospital greatly, beginning her program almost immediately after coming here. Her first move was the development of a medical, surgical and obstetrical staff the equal of any in the country. Then came the addition of a fourth floor and the enlargement of the X-ray rooms.

Detroit, June 7.—The Rt. Rev. Michael J. Gallagher, Bishop of Detroit, has launched a Catholic census of the diocese, to be completed by June 20.

Would Honor Nurse 75 Years a Nurse

Paris, June 6.—The Minister of the Interior is being petitioned to award the Cross of the Legion of Honor to Sister Julie Rizard, hospital religious of the Hotel Dieu of Paris le Monial. He calls attention to the fact that the United States Department of Commerce is taking a religious census throughout the country and is insisting more than ever upon the accuracy of the tabulation. The idea has been received with favor by the directors of the yacht club of France and of the Maritime and Colonial League.

Lourdes Miracles Are Confirmed By Non-Catholic Doctor

(By N. C. W. C. News Service) London, June 4.—At a recent meeting at Wimbledon, a Jesuit, Father Rankin, spoke of Lourdes to an audience composed mostly of Protestants. His accounts of miracles were confirmed by a non-Catholic, Doctor Sherry, who declared he had been an eyewitness of the sudden cure of two very serious cases; one of caries of the bones and one of a fibrous tumor. He examined these two cases very closely and he remained convinced that the sudden cure of these patients was an indisputable miracle. The audience listened with profound interest and the president of the assembly, himself a non-Catholic, showed himself entirely sympathetic to the orators.

Confessional's Seal Is Held Inviolable By German Court

Cologne, June 8.—Following prolonged arguments over the much mooted question as to whether a priest may be forced to give testimony which might be construed as a religious confession, the Rev. Father Berghausen, testifying at the trial of Dr. Broecker and Frau Oberreuter for the murder of the latter's husband, was dismissed without being used to reveal the secrets of the confessional box. Father Berghausen protested against the court having confiscated letters from the doctor to him, but without avail.

Confessional's Seal Is Held Inviolable By German Court

The second Pontifical Mass was celebrated in the Capitol grounds of Sunday morning. The Holy Sacrifice was offered on the steps of the building that was once the royal palace of the Kamehameha dynasty. The Rev. William Kress, A.F.M., preached the sermon. A large orchestra and choir furnished the music and the grounds were surrounded by Catholics who had streamed into the city for the celebration. Amplifiers installed by the army carried the music and sermon to every section of the grounds and Station KGU broadcast the service. A choir of 500, composed of students of St. Louis College and Sacred Hearts Convent, sang the oratorio which was rendered in honor of Father Damien the martyr priest of Molokai who dedicated his life to the lepers and died himself of the dread disease. The words of the oratorio were written by the Rev. Reginald Yzendoorn, S.S.C., and the music by Anton Aerts. Brother Francis Marx, S.M., of St. Louis College directed the choir. The historical drama, "The Prophecy of Kahapuu," was the crowning event of the celebration. It was enacted by the boys of St. Louis College and a rapidly changing cast filled the Princess Theater to witness it. There were 65 in the cast, assisted by a choir of 50 and an orchestra. At present there are more than 100,000 Catholics in the Hawaiian Islands. There are more than 40 priests, most of whom are members of the Society of the Sacred Hearts. The Sisters of St. Francis, whose motherhouse is in Syracuse, recently opened a hospital, while the Sisters of the Sacred Hearts have two flourishing schools in Honolulu, and several smaller schools in the outlying districts. The Marianists have three schools, one each in Hilo, Waikuku and Honolulu. St. Louis College in Honolulu has more than 1,000 pupils. The Maryknollers have one church with one priest and one brother here.

Lourdes Pilgrimage From England Is 925 Strong; 200 Invalids

News Service) London, June 6.—Two hundred invalids, including 70 stretcher and carrying cases, have just left here for Lourdes with a party of 925 on the national pilgrimage organized annually by the Society of Our Lady of Lourdes. The Archbishop of Cardiff, is leading the pilgrimage, which is accompanied by Archbishop Goodford, Bishop Doubleday, Bishop Vaughan and Bishop Barrett. Fifty priests are in the party. Five doctors and thirteen nurses are taking care of the sick. Two special trains went out from London, a specially chartered boat carried the party across the Channel, and special trains took them across France. Knights of St. Columba rendered service to the sick by conveying them to Victoria station on their arrival from the provinces at the other London terminals. For this purpose they were on duty at 3 and 4 o'clock in the morning. To be certain of being on duty, one man slept overnight on the platform at Kings Cross station.

Waive Rule to Permit Sr. Olympia to Remain With Detroit Hospital

(By N. C. W. C. News Service) Detroit, June 10.—After an absence of several days, Sister Mary Olympia returned to Providence Hospital Wednesday to resume her duties as head of that institution. Two weeks ago she was assigned to St. Mary and Margaret Hospital, Dorchester, Mass., and some days ago left for that city. Later, however, it was decided to waive, in this case, the requirement that heads of institutions be changed after a specified time, and to permit Sister Mary Olympia to remain at Providence until several important undertakings are completed. Chief among these are the million-dollar nurses' home being built through the generosity of Mr. and Mrs. Fred Fisher and the \$300,000 infants' home donated by Mr. and Mrs. Charles T. Fisher.

"Lantern of Dead" Ossuary Chapel Is Dedicated

(By N. C. W. C. News Service) Paris, June 13.—In presence of former President Millerand, of Marshal Petain, of a large number of generals and thousands of pilgrims, Msgr. Julien, bishop of Arras, blessed the chapel of Our Lady of Loretto, built on the site of a former sanctuary which was destroyed during the war. This sanctuary, built at the highest point of a plateau, was, it will be remembered, the center of furious combats. The new domes, which serves as an ossuary, dominates cemeteries where sheep 100,000 French and English, who fell between La Bassée and Carenoy. The tower of the chapel, called "Lantern of the Dead," holds a light which, visible for some distance, watches every night over the graves. During the inaugural ceremonies, a choir of 500 voices, in the open air, performed the Requiem Mass of Alexandre Georges.

Chicago Reporter Given a Degree By Marquette

News Service) Chicago, Ill., June 9.—James O'Donnell Bennett, reporter for the Chicago Tribune, tonight was given an honorary degree of Master of Arts by Marquette University of Milwaukee. In the citation for the degree special emphasis was placed upon Bennett's work in connection with the Eucharistic Congress in Chicago last June. Following is the text of the citation: "James O'Donnell Bennett, A. B., journalist, reporter, war correspondent, and dramatic editor who by virtue of his tactful and sympathetic reporting of great events and events of the moment and the stimulating effects of his special articles is entitled to the degree of Master of Arts (honoris causa)." Mr. Bennett attended the University of Michigan where he received an honorary degree of A. B. in 1909.
