YOUR CHILD'S HEALTH

A child is a very complex being and in our dealings with him we have to consider all the phases of his nature. It is very important to give adequate attention to his physical well-being, but physical health alone will not suffice.

This holds true whether the home be one where comforts and luxuries may tend to "spoil" the child or where poverty may preclude a favorable environment for the development of the child's best possibilities.

It is the tendency of the present age to pay a great deal of attention to mental hygiene. The mental health of a community is as important as its physical welfare.
