the disease, but when the person is susceptible to infection by diphtheria, it is followed in about forty-eight hours by redness, with a brownish color at the site of infection. There is no permanent mark left by the test, even when it is positive. Only a few years ago our city health department gave the test to 52,000 children and they learned that: (1) It was not necessary to quarantine or give anti-toxin to children with negative Schick reactions who have been exposed to diphtheria; (2) That it was possible to tell by repeated tests whether the child could be made immune permanently. When the test is positive the administration of toxin—anti-toxin, by means of three injections given at intervals of a week, will give protection or immunity which lasts for years, possibly a life time.
