### Ford And Couzens Give Catholic Club In Detroit \$40,000

Detroit, June 27.—Pledges of \$15,000 by Mrs. Henry Ford and \$25,000 by Senator and Mrs. James Couzens are included in the \$720,292 which has just been raised here by the Detroit League of Catholic Women for a headquarters building and girl's residence-club.  
Although several pledges remain outstanding and will considerably enlarge the sum raised, the campaign has been officially closed, with a meeting at which Msgr. John Doyle, Chancellor of the diocese, representing Bishop Gallagher, who was detained by Confirmation services, congratulated the women on their splendid success. Judge William F. Connolly also spoke, saying of the proposed building:  
"As an institution of social service in this community, this building will serve all without regard to race or creed. It will be of the highest benefit to the girls who come within its walls."

### Bonfires Hail News Killarney Pastor Is Named Bishop

Dublin, June 27.—Bonfires and other manifestations of pleasure and enthusiasm greeted the news that the Very Rev. Michael O'Brien of Killarney had been appointed Bishop of Kerry. The announcement was first made at the meeting of the Women's Confraternity of the Holy Family, and caused prolonged applause in the Cathedral, in spite of the efforts of the director of the Confraternity to suppress it.  
As soon as the news spread around Killarney, the local band led a procession through the town to the residence of Father O'Brien, where a serenade was given in his honor. After dark, several bonfires were lighted, and throngs gathered to congratulate the new Bishop.  
Father O'Brien has had a most distinguished career as a professor of Sacred Scripture and the classics.

**CHILEAN CATHOLIC WOMEN ACT**  
Valparaiso, Chile, July 2.—In spite of numerous hostilities on the part of lodges and of influential persons, the three large groups of Catholic women of Chile are developing satisfactorily. The Young Women's Association now has 23 branches, each having 100 members. The two other groups are the League of Christian Mothers and the League of Chilean Women. The latter has undertaken the teaching of the catechism classes throughout the country. Catholic young women students founded this organization.

**New York Sodality Clubs Buy Estate**  
New York, New York 27.—The Merritt estate in the town of Somers, Westchester, was purchased by the Sodality club of the Diocese of New York from Mrs. Simon Brady. The estate consists of 55 acres bordering the Croton Reservoir, a house of 18 rooms, another house of 14 rooms a large stable and cow barns.  
The property was held at \$65,000 and after building a large swimming pool and making other extensive improvements the Sodality clubs will occupy it as a vacation home for young business women.

### Shaft To French Sailors Blessed By Bishop Duparc

Paris, June 26.—In the presence of M. Georges Leygues, Minister of the Marine, who came to preside in the name of the Government at the civil dedication, Msgr. Duparc, bishop of Quimper, has blessed the monument erected in a memory of sailors who died during the World War.  
The monument is a tall column of granite, surmounted by the figure of a sailor, which has been reared on the rock at St. Matthew's point, the western extremity of Brittany, where the waters of the Channel meet those of the Atlantic.  
While the Bishop was making the sign of benediction the De Profundis was being chanted in memory of the sailors in all the churches of the diocese. When the ceremonies of benediction and dedication were finished two destroyers, cruising in the vicinity, each fired a salvo of 21 guns.

### 60,000 Join Corpus Christi Procession At Scotch Lourdes

London, June 27.—Fourteen loud speakers were installed in the grounds of the Carlin Grotto—the Scotch Lourdes—for the celebration of the Feast of Corpus Christi.  
Fully 60,000 pilgrims took part in a procession of the Blessed Sacrament. This number constitutes a record for Carlin, which already has been the scene of many great pilgrimages.  
It was the stoppage by the police at the instance of an "informer", of a public procession of the Blessed Sacrament at Carlin that led to the passing of the Catholic Relief Act. An inquiry into the causes of the stoppage revived the whole question of Catholic disabilities and resulted in their abolition.

### Bishop Of Canada Urge Celebration Of Nation's Birthday

Toronto, June 28.—Throughout Canada Bishops are requesting the clergy and faithful to join in appropriate celebrations to commemorate the sixtieth anniversary of Canadian Confederation, the birthday of the Dominion of Canada.  
July 1 marks the diamond jubilee of Canadian Confederation. In circular letters and from the pulpit, the Ordinaries are requesting the clergy to conduct special thanksgiving services for the blessings God has showered on the country, and urging the people to supplicate God for continued guidance. Solemn High Mass, appropriate addresses, consecration to the Sacred Heart, the Te Deum, etc., will be part of the services. In many places, religious services will precede the civic ceremonies.

### Detroit Holy Name President Retires

Detroit, June 27.—At the annual convention of the Detroit Diocesan Union of Holy Name Societies, just held here, William P. Bradley retired from office after having served as president for 11 years, almost the inception of the Union. This year he asked to be relieved.  
Two thousand attended the convention rally, and the secretary reported 256 branches now organized in the Detroit diocese. Martin Conboy of New York addressed the rally. The Union plans to promote further branches and intensify its work for juvenile delinquents during the next year. A forum also will be started in the Fall to train Holy Name men in apologetics and public speaking.

### French Pharmacists Declare in Favor Of Sunday Closing

Paris, July 1.—For some time there has been a good deal of controversy in the press on the subject of the Sunday closing of pharmacies. The Prefect of the Seine decided on the closing in order to give the employees of the pharmacies a rest; of course, the laboratories will be open in rotation so that people will be able to get indispensable drugs in case of urgent need.  
Some of the Paris pharmacists, declaring themselves to be devotedly attached to the principles of absolute liberty, provoked a newspaper campaign against this regime, and held that their colleagues, in immense majority, wished to remain free to operate their business on Sunday.  
Finally there was a referendum to find out what all the interested persons thought. The results have just been published. Out of 1,354 pharmacists, 1,022 are in favor of Sunday closing, with emergency service in rotation, and 318 are opposed, 14 not voting. The Catholic Association of pharmacists stood for Sunday closing.

### Priest Says First Mass With Three Brothers On Altar

Cleveland, Ohio, July 2.—The Rev. Alfred J. Gallagher, S. J., one of five Cleveland boys in the class of twenty-six ordained to the priesthood recently in St. Xavier church, St. Louis, by the Most Rev. John J. Glennon, Archbishop of St. Louis, celebrated his first Mass in St. Rose's Church, Sunday, when he was assisted by his two brothers, the Rev. Neil Gallagher, assistant at St. Ann's parish, Cleveland Heights, and the Rev. John Gallagher, chaplain at Parmadale. A third brother, Ralph, who will be ordained in the Jesuit Order in two years, also assisted.  
The Rev. Arthur L. Gallagher, of Youngstown, Ohio, a cousin was in the sanctuary.

### Two of Marquette Faculty Honored

Milwaukee, July 2.—Two professors of Marquette University here have just been honored by other famous institutions.  
Dr. Edward J. Menge, head of the department of zoology at Marquette and author of several biological texts, has been elected to membership in the Brazilian Academy of Medicine and Surgery, an unusual international honor. Dr. John D. Logan, professor of English, has been awarded the honorary degree Doctor of Laws by Loyola University, Chicago, "for distinction in literature and as the foremost living English-speaking Catholic poet in Canada."  
The minister of public instruction of Costa Rica has requested permission for the translation into Spanish of Dr. Menge's newest high school text, "The Laws of Living Things."

### Mullahs Denounce Radio as "Devilish"

Tiflis, Georgia, July 1.—The irrepressible radio, which in its conquest of the world, has penetrated the almost inaccessible regions of Svanetia, is being met with thumbs down by the Mullahs, or Mohammedan priests of that conservative district on the south slope of the Caucasus Mountains.  
The Mullahs therabouts are indulging in fiery diatribes against the "devilish" invention of the enemies of the Prophet, and recently a Western receiving outfit was publicly damned before a huge crowd of onlookers and then thrown down a precipice.  
The influence of the Mullahs has had its results and the radio is taboo in Svanetia.

### Dr. Edwin V. O'Hara Addresses Meeting Of Episcopal Clergy

Gearhart, Oregon, July 1.—The Rev. Edwin V. O'Hara, director of the Rural Life Bureau, of the Department of Social Action, N.C.W.C., conducted the department of social service at the Gearhart Summer School held in connection with the twentieth annual conference of the Episcopal clergy of the Diocese of Oregon, which opened here lately.  
Father O'Hara's lectures were on the social principles of the Gospels, the Encyclical of Leo XIII on the "Condition of Labor," the Church and the rural community, and religious education.
