Cardinal O'Donnell Visits Maynooth

(By N. C. W. C. News Service)
Dublin, July 21.—Cardinal O'Donnell who spent two days at Maynooth College at the close of the scholastic year addressed the students for the priesthood and the priests who are members of the Maynooth Union and asked their prayers for the Church in Mexico and China.

His Eminence asked the prayers of the students that the Irish Hierarchy may be guided in the work of the Plenary Synod to be held in Maynooth this summer. He said that the chief work of the Synod would be to adopt recent canonical legislation to the needs of the Church in Ireland, and that the future of the Church depended as much on the students whose prayers he asked, as on the work of the coming Synod.

California School Board Rule Against Evolution Stands

San Francisco, July 23. The effort of Maynard Shipley, president of the Science League of America, to have the California State Board of Education rescind its action of last year, calling that public school text books dealing with evolution must treat the subject only as a theory and not as a fact, has been denied by the board of education.

CATHOLICS STILL BEING MURDERED BY CALLES CREW

President's Promise To Investigate Blackmailing Of Prominent Laymen Suspected—Priests Among Victims.

Mexico City, July 21.—Official assassinations of priests and Catholic laymen, summary imprisonments, and illegal seizures of Catholic property are continuing today in Mexico as they have in the past few months. This despite announcements sent to the United States, for public effect, that the cases of Catholics who were recently arrested are to be reviewed by the courts.

It is true that Col. Antonio Avila, chief of the judicial military police, has been arrested and that promises have been made of a sweeping investigation of alleged blackmailing activities against Catholics, in which money was extracted on threat of arrest for violations of the anti-religious laws. That grafting officials have been thus conducting blackmail activities no one doubts but that Calles has developed a tender solicitude toward Catholics is believed by no one.

If facts were needed, these might be advanced: A count in the State of Coahuila shows that 46 young men have been killed in that State without trial, charged with rebellion as Catholics. Many of them were of the best families.

Two Priests Executed.
At Jerez, in the State of Zacatecas, Father Felix Castaneda was assassinated some time ago, and only recently Father Moreno, at the same place, was arrested while administering the last rites of the Church to a dying man in his home, and was put to death the same night.

In Guadalupe, a man named Servando Canales was arrested and executed on a charge of sedition. Shortly afterward several well known Catholics and officials of the local League for the Defense of Religious Liberty also were arrested. It is generally believed that by torturing their names were forced from Canales before his death. Evidently the Government realized that with its methods it could afford to destroy the chief witness, it had against persons.

From Guadalupe also, it is reported that Government agents seized Father Jose Gabriel Flores and Gabriel Orozco, aged father of two men believed to be in arms against the Government, and held them as hostages while they attempted to have friends of the two sons produce them. The sons were not betrayed, says the report, and the priest and father were killed despite the fact that neither was charged with or suspected of sedition.

In Mexico City itself, five nuns and seven laymen, including the president of the Catholic Young Men's Association, were arrested in the last few days. The nuns were charged with gathering secretly for religious services.

Father Silverio Aguilar, a Mexican City priest, together with Dr. Eduardo M. Tecuacan, was arrested in the doctor's home because, it was charged, Father Aguilar was caught saying Mass. Both were turned over to the authorities.

It also is reported from Saltillo that the police there have arrested Father Moises Quintanar who, prior to the persecution, was in charge of the Guadalupe shrine. He was talking with friends when he was seized. The police said they found incriminating papers on his person—a common excuse for arrests.

Father J. Maria Villa, formerly of Toluca, was arrested at Puebla charged with celebrating Mass and officiating at weddings. He was released but ordered to report daily to the authorities. He thereupon disappeared, and the police later re-arrested him. He is still in prison.

Government Takes Church.
As for illegal confiscations, President Calles has just issued a decree turning over to the Secretary of Education the parish rectory at El Rosario, in Sinaloa, to be used as a public school. At Tlatlanqui the annexes of the parish church have been turned over to the Treasury Department.

At Tlaxcala the State government has in effect confiscated the only hospital in the State. Formerly, the Adalid estate maintained the hospital, and for this was exempt from taxes. The exemption has been cancelled and the immediate payment of taxes, amounting to \$500,000 is demanded. Since this payment cannot be met, the hospital must go out of existence.

Authorities at Aguascalientes have declared that the hospital there is the property of the Catholic Church and have ordered it sold. Miss Isabel Watson, of English nationality, has appealed to the Supreme Court, setting forth that the property is hers, and is used to house 50 orphans, supported at her own expense. She says that the institution is not connected with any religious organization and that the orphans are threatened with being thrown into the streets.

Printing Plants Raided.
Meanwhile, the Chief of the Department of Security, has raided two

more printing plants, asserting that they were printing matter for the Catholic League.

These continual excesses are only leading to stiffer resistance. The Guadalajara press says that a fresh rebellion has broken out in Jalisco, and that the city of Guzman has been attacked. At Loma Largo a revolutionary group also attacked the garrison.

The Civic League for the Defense of Liberty, the non-sectarian organization formed some time ago, and made up of professional men throughout Mexico, has brought an action in the Supreme Court to halt, if possible, the summary treatment of citizens suspected of sedition. The outcome of this effort still remains to be seen.

North Ireland's Education Bodies Exclude Clergy

Free State Praised by Protestant Bishop for "Impartiality"
Dublin, July 18.—Bishop Miller of the Protestant Diocese of Waterford paid a generous tribute to the Free State Government, at the recent annual meeting of the Protestant Synod for his Diocese.

In referring to the educational position in his Diocese, the Most Rev. Dr. Miller said: "The number of our primary schools is becoming smaller, but every effort is being made to keep as many as possible. It is right to acknowledge the sympathy and generous treatment we receive from the Ministry of Education in this department of our work."

"We are hopeful that some important modifications may yet be made by the educational authorities with regard to the teaching of the Irish language."

Justice Called "Impartial"
"Life and property are now as secure in the Free State as in any country in the world. Justice is administered with the most complete impartiality. Crime is punished with a severity hitherto unknown."

The newspapers reporting Bishop Miller's words, contain accounts of the proceedings of the Department of Education of the Government of Northern Ireland. The latest step taken by the regional education committees set up by the Northern Department is to exclude clergy members of all denominations from seats on the committees. Formanagh County, has publicly protested against this. The Rev. Father Thomas Cotter of Antrim, attended the meeting of the regional committee for Antrim, and made an independent protest against the exclusion of the clergy from the committee which has excluded him from representing the Catholics on that committee, which is to direct educational matters for the next three years.

Secularization Feared.
The exclusion of non-Catholic as well as Catholic clergymen, is regarded by the Northern newspapers as a prelude of fair play to all denominations in educational matters. At best, it is open secularization of education. About a fortnight ago the N. C. W. C. News Service reported the public complaint of a Northern parish priest to whom the Belfast Government sent twelve dollars to cover the cost of heating two Catholic schools for the last six winter months.

At the close of the scholastic year the Very Rev. Dr. MacShane, President of Saint Columba's Diocesan College, Derry, (Northern Ireland) summed up the position with regard to education. He was corroborated in his views by the Most Rev. Dr. O'Kane, Bishop of Derry.

"Irishmen of all shades of political and religious belief, are unanimous in regarding Partition as one of the greatest disasters—perhaps the greatest—that has ever befallen our unhappy country", said Dr. MacShane. "I am not concerned with the political aspect of the situation, but with its bearing on educational matters."

Two Systems Needed.
"The Partition Line cuts right through the Diocese of Derry, and we have to make provision to deal with two different educational systems, as if these Irish boys who come here belonged to two different nationalities. We have to make provision for teaching Irish, Latin, Greek and French, as well as science and mathematics. This is for the pupils going to the Free State, while the pupils for Northern Ireland require only one language in addition to English. We are also handicapped by the Northern Ministry insisting on our giving manual instruction, under penalty of losing grants."

"We are faced with bigotry, with a Capital B. Whether it is of the blatant and vulgar type, or of the polished and intriguing type, it is here entrenched as it never was before."

"Notwithstanding all this", concluded Dr. MacShane, "if our young men grow up serious minded, educated, and determined to assert their rights, we cannot be kept in subjection for evermore."

Pope Pius Alarmed At Suicide Epidemic

Rome, July 12.—Observators Romano, official organ of the Vatican, declaring that religious instruction in youth and the practice of Christianity in later days are the only cures for the wave of self-destruction.

The Holy Father is alarmed by the wave of suicides which, starting in central Europe, has spread to England and the United States. The Vatican paper points out that only the breaking down of Christian morals could permit a soul to reach a state in which self-destruction is possible.
