Parish in England
Observes Jubilee
London, Aug. 1.—At the age of 95, Dom Aldbert O'Sullivan, O. S. B., of St. Augustine's Abbey, Ramsgate, had the happiness a few days ago of rejoicing in the golden jubilee of the Minster parish, which he founded 50 years ago.
Minster was one of the first places in England to be evangelized. It won added fame through the virtues of St. Mildred, the holy Abbess of SS. Peter and Paul's, whose royal mother, Domneva, built the ancient parish church of St. Mary.

50,000 Conversions A Year Are Made In India, Says Bishop
(By N. C. W. C. News Service)
Paris, August 1.—Mgr. Roche, Bishop of Tulle, one of the prelates of India, sketching the situation of the Church there in a letter to Missions Catholiques, says that there are 50,000 conversions a year.
The Catholic population of India, Burma and Ceylon is 3,242,000 souls, and there are now 10 archdioceses, 29 dioceses, 3 vicariates and 2 apostolic prefectures, he adds. The Catholic clergy numbers 3,444 priests, 2,277 of whom are secular and 1,167 religious. About 2,000 are natives. There are 16 missionary congregations of priests and 13 teaching congregations, among the latter the Irish congregation, the Brothers of Saint Patrick.
The 50,000 conversions a year could be doubled or tripled, according to Monsignor Roche, if there were more priests.
"The Protestants and the Muslims," he writes, "concentrate all their energy on converting the low castes. We must use all our strength to convert these poor souls to the Catholic religion. Without exaggeration, one may say that there are 50,000,000 to convert. It is the future of these millions of souls which is at stake today."
Stressing the great dearth of priests, he says that of 600,000 Catholic places, only 1,500 possess a priest in residence, or an average of one for 432.

Caesar A. Grasselli Of Cleveland Dies; Benefactor of Poor
Cleveland, August 1.—The funeral of Caesar A. Grasselli, prominent and wealthy Cleveland Catholic, was held here in St. John's cathedral in the presence of a large assembly of Catholics and non-Catholics.
Mr. Grasselli, who was 77 years old, died recently, following a surgical operation on the previous Tuesday. He was chairman of the board of the Grasselli Chemical company, one of the largest business concerns of its kind in the world.
The Rt. Rev. Joseph Schrembs was celebrant of the Mass and preached, praising Mr. Grasselli's benefactions to local Catholic projects.
In a statement to the daily newspapers on Mr. Grasselli's generosity, Bishop Schrembs cited his gift of his former suburban residence to the diocese as a home for crippled children, the building of a large addition to St. Joseph's hospital at Warren, O., the establishment of a perpetual bursar at the diocesan seminary for the education of a student to the priesthood, and the donation of his former residence on E 55th street as a home for the blind.
The King of Italy and the Pope has honored Mr. Grasselli. The King conferred upon him the Order of the Golden Crown on one occasion and later created him Commander of the same order. These honors recognized Mr. Grasselli's benefactions to the Italian people in times of earthquakes and volcanic disasters. In 1923 Pope Pius XI made Mr. Grasselli Commander of the Order of St. Gregory the Great.

Soviets May Seek Supremacy By War, Fr. E. A. Walsh Says
Washington, Aug. 1.—Europe is sitting on the top of a volcano that is likely to erupt at any time in a serious war for Soviet supremacy, the Rev. Edmund A. Walsh, S. J., vice president of Georgetown University and president of the Catholic Near East Welfare Association, declared upon his return here from a stay in Europe and the Near East.
"In general," Father Walsh said, "the feeling of security throughout Europe is much less than at this time last year, heightened by the break between Great Britain and the Soviet Government and the tense diplomatic relations between Poland and the Soviet, arising out of the assassination of Vorkoff, the Soviet Minister at Warsaw. Other evidences of discord in Europe all tend to emphasize the dangerous undercurrent, he said.
Father Walsh arrived in London the day the Scotland Yard authorities raided the Soviet Embassy. He subsequently conducted personal investigations at the principal sources of authentic information on the Continent and in the Near East. His investigations took him to a dozen or more countries in central and northern Europe.
In Berlin he witnessed the great Communist demonstration in which 100,000 "reds" took part on the outskirts of the German capital. He described the scene as one of "oriental splendor," though deeply significant for its effect on German political conditions. A thousand red banners waved in unison, as 30 "red" orators appealed for Soviet supremacy in Germany and throughout Europe, he said.
Father Walsh was on an annual visit to Europe, not only in the interests of the Catholic Near East Welfare Association, but also to obtain material for a series of public lectures on Soviet Russia which he will give at the Georgetown School of Foreign Service this fall.
Conditions in Russia, he found, were particularly pitiful with thousands on the verge of starvation and misery widespread. The care and feeding of the thousands of American refugees in the Near East and in Greece, particularly, constitute a problem which is no less formidable than a year ago, he said.

Group Conversions Not Seen Following Prayer Book Change

London, July 25.—Further comments by prominent Catholic priests in various parts of this country on the acceptance of the revised Prayer Book by the Anglican Church Assembly reveal no anticipation of group conversions as a consequence, some priests believe, however, that the present stream of conversions will be widened.
The Rev. Vincent McNabb, a distinguished Dominican; the Rev. Vassall Phillips, a Redemptorist, and Father Nicholas, Provincial of the Capuchins, who gave striking opinions soon after the acceptance, have now been joined by two Jesuits, two priests who are converts and Father Ronald Knox, son of a former Anglican Bishop of Manchester.
Father Francis Woodcock, S. J., an authority on the Anglican Church, declares that "in spite of the noisy opposition of extreme Low Churchmen and the rather plaintive protests of extreme Anglo-Catholics, there is no likelihood of group conversions to Nonconformity on the one hand or Rome on the other."
Another distinguished Jesuit, Father Henry Day, saying that the revised Book is "the latest device of the Church of England to set her house in order by placing 'comprehensiveness' on a legal footing," declares: "This scheme is fatal to the purpose intended. Compromise may be vital to politics; it is lethal to religion. A double-mouthed Church is a dumb Church and a dumb Church is a dead Church."
A former Anglican clergyman, Father P. F. Gateley, says: "I do think that all this Prayer Book controversy is making it more and more clear to the average serious-minded Englishman that the religion that says 'Yes' and 'No' to the same proposition, with the same breath, cannot possibly be the Church sent by Christ to teach with authority; therefore, he will be stronger to resist the temptation to allow his conscience to be doped with the cunning counterfeit for Catholicism that the 'Anglo-Catholic' party has to offer at so cheap a price."
Another convert clergyman, Father W. T. C. Sheppard, O. S. B., says the true significance of the measure lies in this, that it is the first formal and authoritative recognition of the hopeless doctrinal confusion that exists in the Anglican Church, and the legal acceptance of that fact as an inevitable and essential principle of Anglicanism.
Father Ronald Knox, son of a former Anglican Bishop of Manchester, says "the only immediate effect will be to make a good many people give up going to church altogether."

Indo-China to Have Catholic Daily Soon
Paris, Aug. 1.—News received from Indo-China through the French missions discloses that a Catholic daily, La Voix Catholique, is about to appear in the colony. Native Catholics have in Tonkin, a tri-weekly paper and those of Annam have a fortnightly bulletin.
In the village of Yontrach a "colony" has just been erected on the high, bearing a bronze figure of Christ, life-size, and dominating an immense plain. Twenty-three priests and 5,000 faithful assisted at the inauguration.
A great college, which will be under the direction of Benedictines, is to be founded at Tonkin. At Saigon, in Cochinchina another college is being organized. The Dominicans will have charge of this institution. Conformable to the wishes of the Holy See, they intend creating a Catholic university when a sufficient number of pupils capable of following the course shall have been enrolled.
