He made it plain, nevertheless, that his regime will continue to mete out drastic punishment for the "public disavowal of the laws dictated on this matter."

Card. Hayes Sings Mass For Brother Edmund, Teacher

New York, Sept. 3.—With His Eminence Patrick Cardinal Hayes officiating at a solemn Mass of Requiem over the body of his old and beloved teacher, funeral services for the Rev. Brother Edmund, for nearly fifty-one years a member of the Christian Brothers, were held in the Church of the Nativity here. Assisting the Cardinal were a number of priests all of whom had come under the influence of Brother Edmund at old De La Salle Institute.

Cardinal Hayes Sings Mass For Brother Edmund, Teacher

When Brother Edmund received the habit of the Christian Brothers more than fifty years ago, he was assigned to teach in old St. Peter's School, here, where he remained for three years. He then spent four years at De La Salle Institute, and four years at Manhattan College, where he taught the sophomore class. From Manhattan he went to Clason Military Academy, where he remained for twenty-eight years, twelve in charge of the graduating class and sixteen as Superior. Twelve years ago he became treasurer of the Province, an office he held until totally incapacitated.
