Fr. Edward Galvin Named Missionary Bishop of China

Omaha, Sept. 10.—Friends in the United States, and especially in this city, of the very Rev. Edward J. Galvin, Superior of the Irish Mission in China, have heard with pleasure that he has just been called by the Supreme Pontiff to the dignity of the episcopate as the first Vicar Apostolic of Han Yang, which carried with it the honor for him of being the first Missionary Bishop of the Society of St. Columban.

Monignor Galvin came to Omaha about ten years ago to establish headquarters for the Irish Mission in China in Omaha. He had served as a missionary to China from 1912 to 1916 and seeing the great possibilities for missionary work there, he returned to Ireland and organized the Society of St. Columban for mission work in China.

Having established the mission on a firm footing by securing volunteers from Maynooth from among professors and students, and collecting funds to purchase an estate for a seminary, he went to Omaha and was given encouragement by Archbishop J. J. Hart to make that city the American headquarters for the society. He immediately began the publication of "The Far East," mission magazine, and with other volunteers made it a success.

Meanwhile the students whom he had left preparing in Ireland for mission work had completed their course, and in the summer of 1920, Father Galvin left Omaha for China at the head of the first band of six-teen priest members of a newly founded missionary society, the Chinese Mission Society of St. Columban. As an earnest of the permanence of his work, he left behind him a body of eager students preparing to follow him and a growing organization that had spread into three continents.

The Vicariate Apostolic of Han Yang, over which the Holy Father has chosen Monignor Galvin to rule as Bishop, is situated in the heart of China where the Han and Yangtze rivers meet to form the largest river port in the world. Here in this great commercial center, with fifty priests of the Society of St. Columban, he administers to a flock of approximately twenty thousand souls, scattered through a pagan population of more than five million.

Associated with the missionaries of Han Yang are the Sisters of Loreto, the Missionary Sisters of St. Columban, the Christian Brothers and a number of native priests and catechists. During the past year Monignor Galvin has gone through stormy days in his effort to remain with his flock and encourage them to persevere in the face of tremendous odds. He has succeeded and brighter days are showing ahead, beckoning him on to greater labors in the Master's vineyard.

Experts of Vatican Library Reach U. S.

New York, Sept. 12.—Monignor Giorgio Benedetti, the Rev. Carlo Scala and Professor Giordano Ignio and Gerardo Bruni, the four representatives of the Vatican Library, who have come to study the American library system, arrived in New York lately. Msgr. Benedetti and Father Scala will go direct to the Boston Public Library, while Professors Bruni and Ignio will study the library system at the University of Michigan.

Referring to the great library of the Vatican, which is to be catalogued and indexed by the Carnegie Foundation for International Peace, Father Scala said:

"We receive books from all over the world and file them irrespective of their nature, letting them decide their value to the world."

Maryknoll Sisters Depart for Orient

Sister Marie Renee will join the staff of the Catholic Normal School at Malabon suburb of Manila. This institution is directed by the Maryknoll Sisters and trains native Catholic teachers for the Philippine Islands.

Mrs. Cunliffe-Owen, Known As 'Marquise De Fontenoy, Dead

New York, Sept. 3.—Funeral services for the Countess Marguerite Cunliffe-Owen, well-known Catholic writer, who died Sunday of myocarditis at her home here, were held at St. Patrick's Cathedral Aug. 30, with a solemn Mass of Requiem. The Rev. Bernard F. McQuade was the celebrant.

In ill health for the last three years, the distinguished writer, known internationally under her pseudonym, "The Marquise de Fontenoy," had never recovered from the shock of the death of her husband, Frederick Cunliffe-Owen, former British diplomat and writer, a year ago. She had never left the house since his death and had been seriously ill for six weeks. She was 66 years old. No close relatives survive her. An only son, Algernon, born in 1888, died several years ago.

Countess Cunliffe-Owen, daughter of one of the oldest noble houses of France and counting Louis XIV and King Henry of Navarre among her ancestors, had had a varied and eventful life. One-time confidante of the Empress of Austria, she had known poverty in New York until she and her husband made a place for themselves by their writings.

The Countess was the author of numerous novels, but her most notable work was "The Martyrdom of an Empress," the biography of Empress Elizabeth of Austria, published in 1899, a year after the assassination of the Empress by an anarchist in Geneva.

The book was published anonymously, and the first admission on that she was its author came from a member of the household today. The book attracted wide attention on both sides of the Atlantic, for it contained an extraordinarily dramatic version of the "tragedy of Mayerling"—the mysterious deaths of the Austrian crown prince, Rudolph, and the beautiful Marie Vetsera, in his hunting lodge in January, 1889.

High School Opened For Negro Children In Cincinnati, Ohio

Cincinnati, O., Sept. 10.—Notre Dame Academy which contains more than 20 rooms, and is one of the oldest academies for girls in Cincinnati will become a high school for negro children on September 12, when it will reopen with a staff of Sisters of the Blessed Sacrament. It is said there are only five other Catholic high schools or academies in this county.

The academy convent which has been a home for Notre Dame Sisters teaching in parochial schools, will be the convent home of the Sisters of the Blessed Sacrament, who teach at Holy Trinity and St. Ann Schools.

The high school is the fruit of the mission for the negroes opened in Cincinnati's West End two years ago, when Archbishop McNicholas put the Rev. Leo M. Walsh in charge of Holy Trinity, second oldest Catholic church in the city, and one of the most prosperous German parishes of Cincinnati. The school, which had been closed for a year, was opened again last September by Father Walsh with an attendance of 200 negro children, nearly all from non-Catholic homes.

Father Walsh is now the general director of the mission work among the negroes of the city.
