Justice Dowling Returns Praising The New Italy

New York, Sept. 30.—Victor J. Dowling, Presiding Justice of the Appellate Division of the Supreme Court of New York, returned recently from his first visit to Europe. Justice Dowling, one of the country's most prominent Catholics, together with George MacDonald, also of New York, had a long interview with His Holiness the Pope while in Rome, a full report of which was carried by the N. C. W. C. News Service in a recent release. During his audience with the Holy Father Justice Dowling was nominated Chamberlain of the Cape and Sword, an office which makes him an honorary member of the Pope's household.

The distinguished jurist had only praise for Italy under the rule of Mussolini. He said he was impressed particularly with the cleanliness of the streets and the complete absence of beggars. Every one, he said, seemed to be working hard for the upbuilding of the country.

"Mussolini wants foreign visitors," he said. "He told me in an interview of his plans for cleaning away modern buildings which now hide the ancient monuments in the center of Rome, and making it an international museum for all Europeans and Americans to enjoy."

Justice Dowling said that during the three months he was in Italy, France and Belgium, he did not see a single case of drunkenness.

He said further that Premier Poincare of France told him that three times he had planned to visit America and had each time been forced to abandon the trip.

Berlin Papal Nuncio Travels By Airplane To Catholic Assembly

Cologne, Sept. 19.—Monsignor Pacelli, the Papal Nuncio at Berlin, travelled by airplane from Trier to Dortmund to attend the General Catholic Assembly. He planned to make the return trip to Berlin in the same way.

The Papal Nuncio was in Trier to take part in the celebration held in honor of St. Matthias, the Apostle, whose relics have rested in that town for 600 years. At the conclusion of these exercises, he made the trip to Dortmund in an airplane supplied by the German Ministry of Commerce and with the approval of the Control Commission of the Rhineland. He also went by airplane to Breslau where the Catholic assembly was held there in 1926. In his New Year's address in Berlin, he spoke of the utility and importance of air transportation.

Many bishops and abbots and a great number of priests took part in the solemn procession which was a feature of the exercises at Trier. State and municipal authorities and various unions and congregations also participated. The Lord Mayor, Dr. Wetz, and Bishop Dr. Bornwasser made addresses to the Papal Nuncio.

In his sermon in the basilica, following the procession, Monsignor Pacelli declared that the Trier district is holy country, and said that it is the duty of the present generation to carry the banner of Christ through their time for the sake of the people and the nation.

Ruling On Dancing Evils May Be Made By Irish Hierarchy

Dublin, Sept. 26.—The closing of the Irish Synod at Maynooth has caused many Catholics to wonder if the legislation considered by the Bishops included the regulation of dancing. During the last twelve months, most of the Irish archbishops and bishops have on various occasions spoken of the evils arising from unrestrained dancing, especially when continued all night or far into the early hours. What are known as "all night dances" are the especial subject of ecclesiastical denunciation.

In their Lenten Pastors, the Bishops of both Waterford and Achonry alluded to this subject.

"Dance houses," said the Most Rev. Dr. Hackett, Bishop of Waterford, "in which there is not proper supervision and where improper dances are carried on have told and will tell their tales."

The Most Rev. Dr. Morrison, Bishop of Achonry, alluded directly to the possibility of legislation.

"During the present year," said the Bishop "a National Synod will be held in Ireland. It is very probable that strict legislation will inhibit attendance at certain dances under severe penalties. Under the circumstances, we do not wish to say more than this."

Meanwhile, the results of the Irish Synod have not been made public.

Indiana Must Free Self of Klan, Says Attorney General

Terre Haute, Ind., October 1.—Government in Indiana, and the people of Indiana, must be released from the grip of super-government that has been fastening on them," Arthur L. Gilliom, Attorney General of Indiana and bitter foe of the Ku Klux Klan in this State, declared in an address here recently before the Hamilton Club.

Mr. Gilliom condemned the entire Klan movement and the fanaticism and bigotry it represents. He declared that his party, the Republican, must align itself against super-government, which, he asserted, was alien to its principles.

"Concerning conditions in Indiana," he said:

"Organized fanatics and intolerances under the leadership of individuals who give their whole time to the commercializing and to the politicalizing of intolerance and fanaticism have undertaken to set up a super-government in Indiana over political parties and over constitutional government.

"These super-government groups have succeeded in considerable degree in establishing their power over the people of Indiana by making candidates of both political parties in considerable numbers primarily responsible to them either under oaths of super-allegiance, under corrupt bargains or under the threat of massed group opposition at the polls. More than this, these groups undertake to exercise direct power over the people through their own representatives, such as the horse thief detective associations and specially authorized association attorneys.

"The overshadowing issue before the people of Indiana in the next campaign will be whether we shall have genuine representative government by political parties or whether we shall have super-government by intolerant and fanatical minority groups."

Father Jaglowicz Departs For Rome To Assume Office

Louisville, Sept. 30.—The Very Rev. Michael Jaglowicz, C. R., beloved president of St. Mary's College, St. Mary, Ky., for the past twenty-six years, will sail on the liner Roma for Rome, October 8, to assume his duties as First Counsellor of the Order of the Resurrection. He will remain in his new field of labor until the summer of 1932 when, it is hoped by his host of friends here, he will be able to return to old Kentucky.

Father Michael, as he is familiarly known to all in these parts, came to St. Mary's in September, 1897. He held the post of disciplinarian during the first two years at the college. In 1899 he was made vice-president of the institution and he served in this capacity until 1901, when he was made president of the school. He has remained faithfully at the helm ever since.

Previous to his coming to St. Mary's Father Michael spent six years at the Gregorian University in Rome. He was ordained a priest in Rome on May 30, 1896, by Cardinal Casetta, in the Basilica of St. Mary Major. He has been back to Rome three times since his first stay, each time as a delegate to the general chapter of the Order.

Methodist Minister Hopes Catholic May Become President

Denver, Sept. 30.—Colorado Methodist Episcopal ministers, in session at Trinity church here, recently heard Stanley B. High, representative of the board of foreign missions of the Methodist church, declare himself in favor of a Catholic President of the United States.

"The principal issue of the 1928 Presidential election is being befogged by individuals who would make the issue one of religious intolerance," declared Mr. High. "The real issue will be prohibition, but the candidacy of Governor Al Smith has given rise to an unjust issue of religion.

"I am not an anti-Catholic. I hope and trust that some day the United States will have a Roman Catholic as President."

Gigli, Noted Tenor, St. Gregory Knight

Rome, Sept. 29.—The insignia of the Order of St. Gregory the Great recently was bestowed upon Benjamin Gigli, the noted tenor, by His Holiness Pope Pius XI.

Gigli gave a concert lately to obtain funds for a chapel in memory of all World War dead as part of the international peace temple being built here.

Spain Seeks Curb On Infant Deaths By Aiding Mothers

(By N. C. W. C. News Service)
Madrid, Sept. 26.—A projection plan for obligatory insurance has been drawn up and presented to the Ministry of Labor, Commerce and Industry for approval. It is believed that its enforcement will not only decrease infant mortality, but will tend to improve the physical condition of the population in general.

The new bill includes provision for financial assistance, medical attention and free pharmaceutical supplies for working mothers, as well as the free use of baby clinics. An obligatory rest period of unemployment for six weeks both before and after the birth also is specified.

Financial assistance to be given under the proposed legislation would total not more than 200 pesetas for each birth. The funds from which

These payments would be made would be supplied by contributions from the State, the women's employers and the women themselves, the share of the State to be 150 pesetas in every case, and the employers and employed women to pay 6 pesetas year each in every case.
