To Set Up Mosaic Workers' School At Westminster

London, Jan. 16.—A permanent school of mosaic workers may be instituted at Westminster Cathedral, Cardinal Bourne announces in a statement concerning the progress of the work of interior decoration. His Eminence estimates that the work will probably occupy a century or more.

Plans have been prepared for the mosaic decoration of the Lady Chapel, but the estimates received for the work are so far in excess of the amount at present at the Cardinal's disposal that His Eminence hesitates to undertake it.

"It has been suggested," he says, "that the best method of dealing with the mosaic of the cathedral would be to proceed, not by way of separate contracts with existing firms, but rather to set up in the cathedral precincts a permanent school of mosaic workers, such as has existed and now exists at St. Mark's, Venice.

"In all probability the mosaic decoration of the cathedral will occupy a century or more, and when the work is finished it will, as is the case at Venice, constantly call for renewal and repair, so that mosaic workers will be a necessary part of the establishment of the cathedral for all time."
