

KLAN GOT \$100,000 OF OIL FUNDS, SEN. WALSH INTIMATES

Tells Will H. Hays He Has It On Good Authority That the Payment Was Made, But Hays Denies Knowledge of It—Admission of Edward Young Clarke, Former Leader of Klan—Revelations Blow to Religious Bigotry

Washington, March 15.—The Ku Klux Klan was suddenly thrust into the Senate oil scandal hearings here this week. It was broadly intimated that the Klan received \$100,000 of the tainted "slush fund" the disposition of which the Senate committee has been tracing for months.
