Sport of Egg-Rolling Popular in England

Egg-rolling is still a popular Easter pastime in parts of northern England, notably at Preston. The eggs used are boiled very hard and are artificially colored. Thousands of factory workers gather on the hillsides on Easter Monday and roll their eggs down the slopes.

"Good Egg!" The object of the competitors is to break as many as possible of their rivals' eggs, the winner being the one whose egg remains intact the longest. At the end of the day the slopes are literally buried beneath eggshells, for as soon as an egg cracks it is eaten by its owner. To avoid disputes the name of the owner is generally written on his egg.

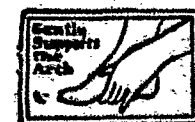
