**Lack of Priests In Island of Corsica**  
(By N. C. W. C. News Service)  
Ajaccio, May 11.—Mgr. Rodie, Bishop of Ajaccio, has pointed out to his diocese the grave danger to religion in Corsica because of lack of priests and vocations. There are 110 vacant parishes and at least a fourth of the clergy are over 70 years of age. There should be no less than 200 seminarians in order to supply the demand for priests on the island, but the Petit Seminary can accommodate only 83 students.  
The new bishop is appealing to the generosity of the faithful to increase the facilities for study and to erect a votive chapel to the Sacred Heart at the Grand Seminary.

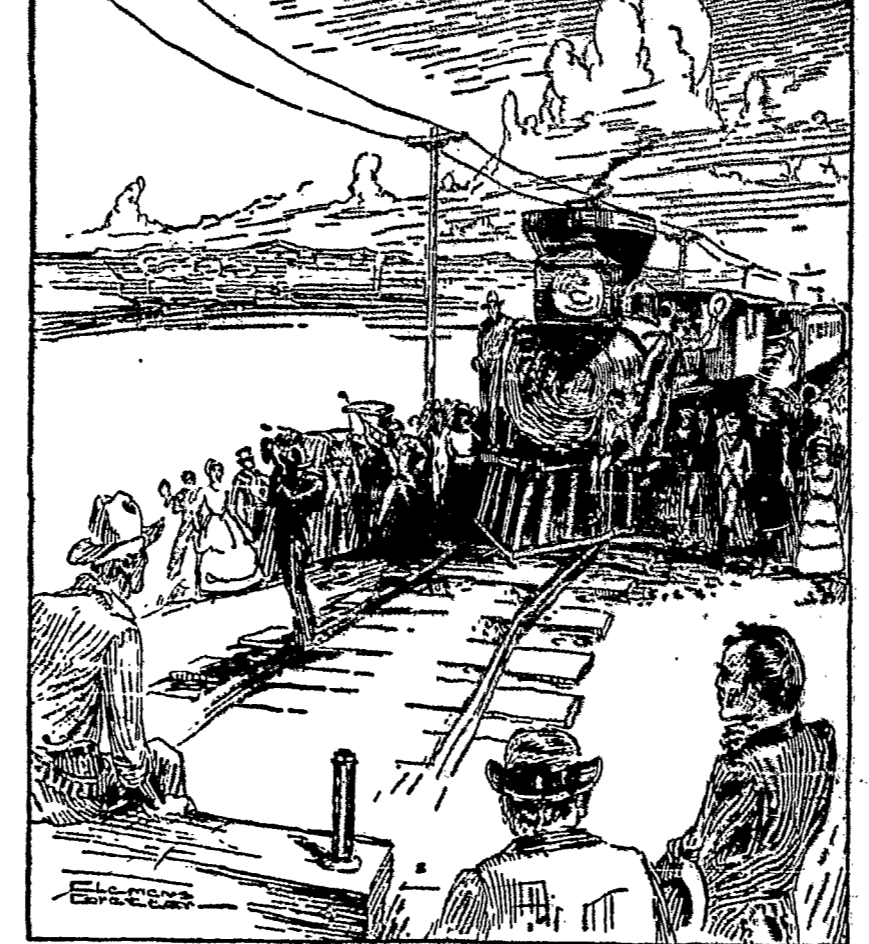
**Swiss Augustinians Going To Indo-China**

Saint Maurice, Switzerland, May 10.—The Swiss Augustinian Abbey of Saint Maurice is planning a foundation in Indo-China, and as soon as the site of the new Abbey has been definitely fixed, a group of Augustinian Canons will depart for the new foundation. They will introduce in Indo-China the full monastic observance, including the chanting of the Divine Office. They also have in mind education work.

**St. Mary's Conducts Graduation on New College Campus**  
San Francisco, May 18.—The 1928 class of St. Mary's College, the last to complete its studies in the old college buildings in Oakland, was graduated at ceremonies held Sunday on the campus of the new college near Moraga, Contra Costa County. Hundreds of alumni and friends attended the exercises, special boat and train schedules arranging for their transportation to the 406-acre campus site where 14 buildings are being erected.  
Brother Leo, F. S. C., dean of the department of English, delivered the graduation address. Brother Gregory, provincial of the Christian Brothers on the Pacific coast, presented the degrees, assisted by Brother Lewis, president of St. Mary's College, and Brother Vanshan, secretary of the board of trustees.  
The graduation program included an academic procession conducted through the Justin grove, named for Brother Justin, who established St. Mary's College in 1864.
