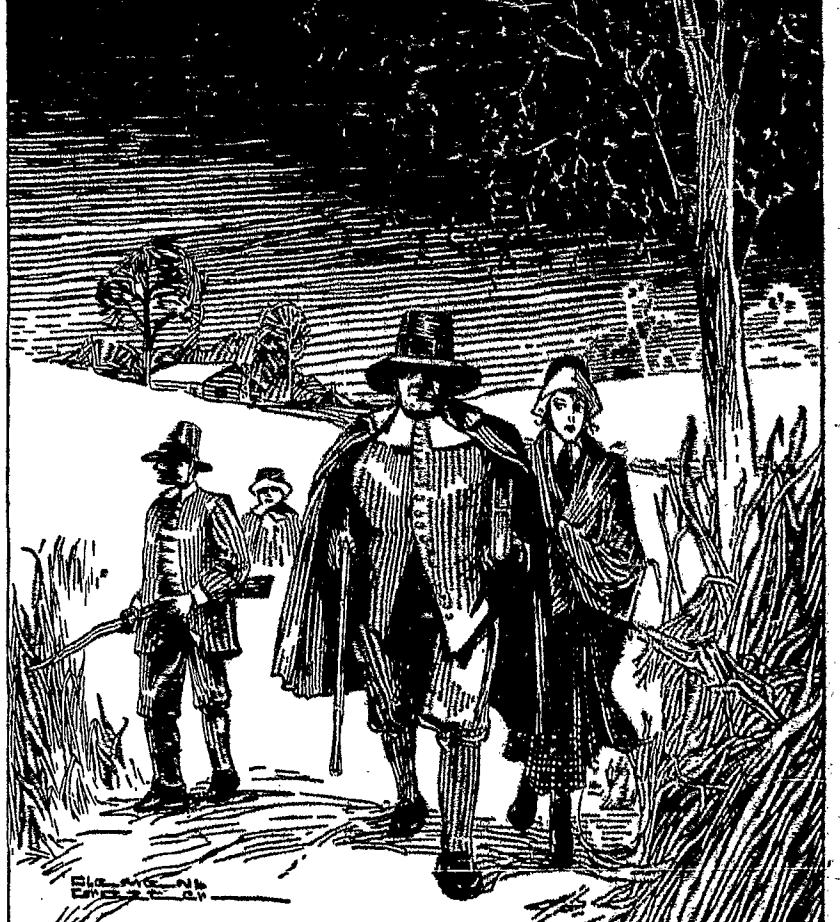
Priest Remembers

St. John, New Brunswick, May 29.—The Rev. William Hales Hingston, S. Rare Volumes Given To National Shrine

Washington, June 4.—Two volumes of the original Italian edition of "The Gates of Mary" by St. Alphonsus Liguori, printed in 1788, 23 years before the saint's death, have just been presented to the National Shrine of the Immaculate Conception here. The volumes were donated by the Rev. Prosper Parente, S. D. S.
To the last page of the first volume is attached a piece of paper on which is announced the presentation of the volume by Pope Pius VII to one of his friends, a Cardinal. The inscription is in the Pope's own handwriting.
St. Alphonsus Liguori was born at Marianella, near Naples, September 27, 1696, and died at Novara, Italy, August 1, 1787.

Pope Pius Sent His Blessing To C. P. A. Convention

New York, May 21.—Father Cardinal Hayes, Archbishop of New York, has received and transmitted to the C. P. A. the following telegram from Cardinal Caspari, Papal Secretary of State:
"Cardinal Hayes, please convey the blessing of the Holy Father on the delegates assembled in New York at the annual convention of the Catholic Press Association."
One of the first actions of the press convention was the appointment of a committee which immediately dispatched greetings and the presence of other delegates to Pope Pius XI.
