Official Roumania Honors Archbishop Cisar At Jubilee

News Service) Bucharest, July 9.—The recent celebration of the silver jubilee of Monsignor Cisar, Archbishop of Bucharest, surpassed any Church ceremony in Roumania heretofore and was participated in by officials of the Roumanian government. This is attributed to Monsignor Cisar's unwavering loyalty to decrees of state and his ability to arouse similar loyalty in his people.

The Pontifical High Mass was attended by civil and military dignitaries and diplomats from France, Belgium, Austria, Czechoslovakia, Poland, Spain, and Germany. The choir, supplemented by soloists from the Grand Opera and accompanied by orchestra as well as organ, sang Gounod's St. Cecilia Mass, the greatest composition of the illustrious French composer of religious music.

The Archbishop addressed the assembly in the purest Roumanian, and the effect of his remarks was reflected in the speeches of the Minister of Religious Cults and other civil authorities at the banquet that evening, in which they praised his spirit of cooperation and helpful understanding of the problems of present-day Roumania.

But the Archbishop not only enjoys the esteem of the Government, but also that of his flock. The jubilee occasioned numerous celebrations in Catholic circles, and as an expression of love and esteem, a purse of a half-million lei was given to Monsignor Cisar. It is thought that this sum will be used to redecorate the rooms of the episcopal residence and to purchase an automobile for use in diocesan visits.

Learned Body Honors 2 Priest-Explorers

Paris, July 9.—The French Geography Society has decorated two members of the Congregation of the Holy Ghost, Father Tastevin and Father Dalgre. The former received the Louise Bourbonnand gold medal for his explorations in the upper basin of the Amazon and his collecting of native dialect vocabularies and ethnographical notes on the customs and folk-lore of the Indian tribes of the great Amazon jungle. The Don prize—a silver medal and 1500 francs—was given Father Dalgre for his explorations in the region of Oubanghi in French Equatorial Africa.

Father Tastevin, who is the first occupant of the chair of ethnography founded at the Catholic University of Paris last year, also was decorated with the Legion of Honor, and prizes to that received the Bonaparte, Weisse and Crevaux gold medals.

Little Flower Shrine Dedicated In Brazil

Sao Paulo, Brazil, July 9.—The new sanctuary of St. Teresa of the Child Jesus has been dedicated by Msgr. Duarte Silva, Archbishop of Sao Paulo. The commanding officer of the military region, the director of public works and a representative of the President participated in the ceremony.

Buenos Aires, July 9.—The Argentine writer, G. Martinez Zuviria, remarked upon his return from a visit to the United States that he was particularly impressed by the devotion of North Americans to the Carmelite saint, The Little Flower of Jesus. He mentioned especially a statue of St. Teresa in a Neapolitan restaurant in New York City which called to his mind the deathbed words of the Little Flower: "All the world will love me."
