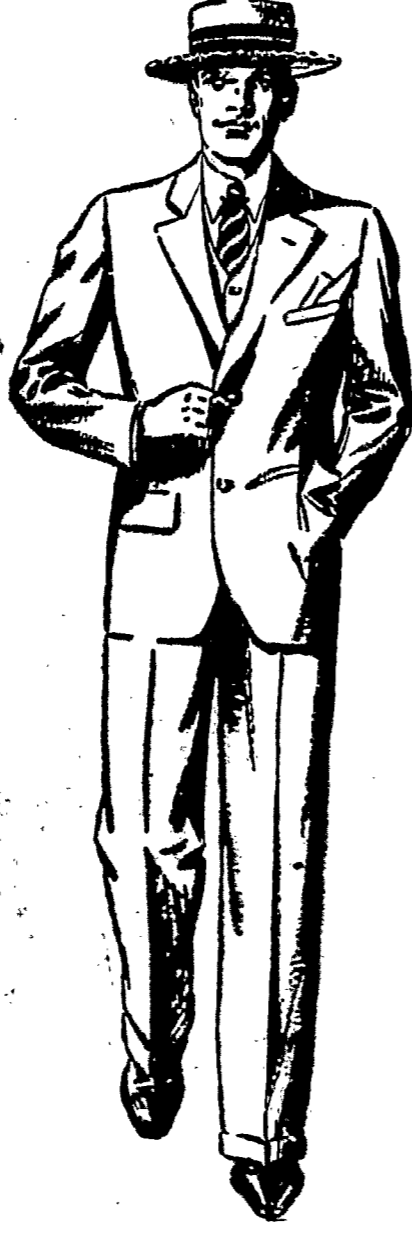

### San Diego Welfare Bureau's Activities

San Diego, July 14.—In a report submitted to the Rev. Thomas J. O'Dwyer, director of the San Diego Catholic Welfare Bureau, the following activities are recounted:

In 396 cases employment was secured for persons appealing to the bureau, enabling them to become self-supporting; baptisms were arranged for 32; marriages were validated for 19 couples, and 156 persons were taken to Mass from the Vocational House. The Sisters of Nazareth labored with great success to meet the needs of unfortunate children, the average number in the Home at the time being 56.

### MONSIGNOR GIVES \$10,000 TO URSULINES

Cleveland, O., July 12.—The Ursuline Sisters of Cleveland today announced a donation of \$10,000 from Msgr. Francis T. Moran, who has just retired as pastor of St. Patrick's parish here to become rector of the diocesan seminary. Msgr. Moran was pastor 27 years.

The gift is the largest the Ursulines have ever received, according to the local mother superior and in recognition of the work of the Ursuline Sisters in the conduct of St. Patrick's school. St. Patrick's parish will, it is expected, observe its seventy-fifth anniversary later in the year.

### Why "Eve's Apple Tree"

Among the many botanical curiosities of Ceylon is a fruit supposed to bear the marks of Eve's teeth!

The tree on which it grows is known by the significant name of "Forbidden Fruit," or "Eve's Apple Tree." The blossom is pleasantly scented, and the fruit is orange in color outside and a deep crimson within. Each fruit has the peculiar appearance of having a piece bitten out of it.

This fact, together with its poisonous quality, led to the belief that it was the forbidden fruit of the Garden of Eden, and serves the useful purpose of warning such as might be tempted by its lovely appearance to imitate Eve and take a bite.

### Old Monarchical Idea

The name "Divine Right of Kings" is given to a doctrine that was promulgated in England in the Seventeenth century. It asserted that kings held their authority by divine appointment and were earthly representatives of the Deity. This principle relieved the sovereign of all responsibility toward his subjects, and gave him absolute claim to their obedience. The chief defenders of this dogma were Salmasius, Hobbes and Sir Robert Filmer; while Milton, Algernon Sydney and Harrington were its uncompromising opponents. The controversy died a natural death on the accession of the House of Hanover. In the Bill of Rights (1689) the right of the people to depose the sovereign, to alter the order of succession, and to confer the sovereignty on whomsoever they may think proper is distinctly set forth.—Kansas City Star.
