Christopher Cullen, Member of K. of C. Tour, Dies Abroad

London, July 16. — While at Lourdes with the Knights of Columbus San Francisco Council (No. 618) party which is touring Europe, Christopher Cullen died there last Saturday, according to a telegram received here by his wife. No details of his death are available.

Cullen was an Irishman who for many years lived in London and who about a year ago went to California where he joined the San Francisco Council. When the Council planned a European tour he was deputed to make the arrangements for the party's reception in England and Ireland. In London he was successful in arranging, through the Knights of Columbus, a reception by Cardinal Bourne, which is due to take place on August 1. In Ireland President Bourne has promised to receive the visitors.

London, July 14. — The new High Commissioner of Palestine, in place of Field Marshal Lord Plumer, is Lieut. Col. Sir John Robert Chancellor. It is announced here that the King has approved the appointment. Since 1923 he has been Governor and Commander-in-Chief of Southern Rhodesia. Before that he occupied successively similar positions in Mauritius, Trinidad, and Tobago.

KNIGHTS OF COLUMBUS

Cleveland Expects 20,000 for Annual Supreme Convention

One of the largest gatherings of Catholics since the Eucharistic Congress in Chicago is scheduled for Cleveland the week of August 19, when Knights of Columbus from every corner of the United States and its possessions meet there for their annual supreme convention. Visitors to the number of 20,000 composed of the families and friends of the more than 700 accredited delegates are expected to come.

Five Degrees In Five Weeks at Vancouver

The Vancouver Bulletin, in a recent issue, paid a high compliment to the British Columbia Knights and commented particularly on the fact that though handicapped by reason of their 13 Councils being scattered over the immense area that comprises the Province of British Columbia and that 1,300 miles of land and water separate Prince Rupert Council on the north from Fernie Council to the east, located in the famous "hot town" of Fernie "nestling in the Solikirks on the eastern border of the Province, the jurisdiction has gone on record with five initiations during the five weeks period from May 20th to June 24th conferring Knighthood on more than 250 candidates.
