Funds For Political Campaign Are Asked By Conn. Ku Kluxers

Bridgeport, Conn., July 31.—The Ku Klux Klan of Connecticut is sending broadcast through the state an open letter, in which all former members are reminded that the organization, which many "think is dead," needs their assistance during the present political campaign. "When you stay away from our meetings," says the letter in part, "you give aid to the enemy; when you become delinquent in your dues, you give aid to the enemy; when you inject personal likes and dislikes in your Klan meetings, you give aid to the enemy. And many of us have done all these things. "Klan members where is your loyalty you swore to hold? I know there are thousands of loyal Connecticut-Rhode Island members, but I also know there are thousands who 'forget' and let their personal feelings interfere with their obligations. "The E. C. who every night picks flaws in Dr. Evans, in Senator Healin, in the Grand Dragon, or who says the Klan is dead, has lost all respect for himself. He is tearing down his own society by preaching a defeatist program. He is the friend of the enemy." The letter is believed to have been written by John W. Perry, present Grand Titan, who was recently arrested for perjury following a Klan investigation by the Rhode Island Legislature.

Contract Awarded For Stained Glass To Cost \$250,000

Pittsburgh, Pa., July 30.—What is said to be the largest contract for stained glass ever made in the United States has just been awarded to George W. Sotter, Hollings, Pa., for the Jewelled windows in Sacred Heart church here. The total cost of the windows when finished will be about a quarter of a million dollars. The glass is so precious, and the work is so carefully done by hand, and the windows are so large and numerous, that from 20 to 25 years will be required to complete the contract. Mr. Sotter's first group of Medieval windows, on which he has been working for five years, will be put in place during the present week, and it is confidently expected that the glass will be among the finest in the United States, rivaling the famous jewelled glass at Sainte Chapelle, Paris, and at Chartres.
