Crypt, Pledged In War, Consecrated In Venice

(By N. C. W. C. News Service) Venice, Aug. 6.—Consecration of the crypt of the votive temple on the Lido is the beginning of the fulfillment of a vow made by the Venetians in the World War.

The body of the first Venetian soldier to lose his life in the aerial defense of the city has been placed in the crypt. When the church is completed, the bodies of hundreds of other Venetian soldiers will be placed there.

On Epiphany Sunday, 1917, the Venetians, fearing a bombardment from Austrian airplanes, flocked to the Cathedral of St. Mark to pray for the safety of the city and its priceless treasures. The vow to build the church was made by Cardinal La Fontaine, Patriarch of Venice, amid the fervent acclamations of thousands of Venetians.

Church Law Reform Urged For Mexico

San Francisco, Aug. 9.—Dr. Jose Vasconcelos, Minister of Education under the Obregon administration in Mexico, university professor and authority on international law who is in San Francisco, says Mexico must have a change in its laws on religion.

"What we need in Mexico today," he declared, "is government by the people and not by the sword."

Among the salient points in his platform for Mexico are:

- 1. A sweeping change in the Church law, which President Calles enforced, and which has led to internal strife.
2. The non-re-election of the President.
3. Land reforms that will place the Indians in a position to own land that they now till under the peonage system.
4. Closer relationship between the United States and Mexico.
"To please justice and the world we must make a change in the church law," Dr. Vasconcelos says. "It has led to rebellion and chaos. But the change must come; we must return to civilization if we are to exist as a nation. Calles and the military leaders now are the great landowners. But that land belongs to the poor, to the Indian who tills it, and it must be returned to him. This is the one economic solution of the problem." Dr. Vasconcelos has been mentioned as a possible future President of Mexico. REV. JOHN M. SIMON DEAD Salt Lake City, Aug. 5.—The Rt. Rev. Bishop John J. Mitty, D.D., has been notified of the death of the Rev. John M. Simon, O.S.M., at Denning, N.M. Father Simon was for many years in the service of the Diocese of Salt Lake. His death is a distinct loss to Catholic literature. He was a noted scriptural scholar and a frequent contributor to religious periodicals. Death was due to tuberculosis from which Father Simon had suffered for many years.
