

Rector Will Observe Golden Anniversary

The Rev. Mathias J. Hargather To Observe Golden Jubilee of His Ordination to Priesthood

The Rev. Mathias J. Hargather, rector of St. Michael's Church, will observe the 50th or golden jubilee of his ordination to the priesthood Sept. 30.

His anniversary falls on the preceding day—the 29th—but as the following day is Sunday it has been decided to have the observance on the 30th.

Father Hargather is a native of Rochester and a graduate of St. Peter and Paul's parochial school. He was born in 1855 and after leaving St. Peter and Paul's School he attended the Christian Brothers Academy and then was sent to Milwaukee where he studied for the priesthood in St. Francis de Sales College, afterward going to St. Joseph's Provincial Seminary in Troy, N. Y., where he completed his studies.

At Greece and Coldwater While serving as assistant at the Cathedral Father Hargather also was chaplain at St. Mary's Hospital and at St. Mary's Orphan Boys' Asylum.

Built New Church St. Michael's parish, in the 54 years of its history, has had only two pastors. The first was the Rev. Fridolin Pascalar who was appointed in 1874, nearly two years after the parish was organized.

The brigands had already gained entrance and were starting their plundering, when one of their number reminded the rest that the missionaries were the men who helped the wounded and dying.

Priest Introduces Brick Building Among Burma Aborigines

Toungoo, India.—Building the first block cement house in Toungoo the heart of Burmese India and thus introducing the idea to the native tribes is a distinction that belongs to the Reverend Carlo Gusmaroli. Two years ago he imported from Italy a machine for making cement blocks.

The introduction of the idea was not without difficulties. As no one of the Burmese understood the machine or the art of cement building, the priest had to do all the labor. He erected a convent, a school, a large reservoir, a hall and a good sized church. As soon as the people saw the success of the new method of building machines were imported, and the natives started their own building.

The Vicariate of Toungoo is in East Burma and is under the care of the Milan Foreign Mission Society. It contains 23,555 Catholics out of a total population of about 5,000,000.

First Apostolic Delegate To Indochina Dead

Rome.—Cable dispatches from Saigon, Sunday, July 29, to the Sacred Congregation of Propaganda Fide, announce the death in that city of Monsignor Constantine Aluti, Titular Archbishop of Fasi and first Apostolic Delegate to Indo-China.

His Excellency Monsignor Aluti was named to this important post by Apostolic Brief of May 23, 1925, and was named to his important post by bishop by Consistorial Decree of May 28, 1925.

From his residence at Hanof, he communicated upon his arrival the program which he bore with him from Rome, and after visiting many of the individual bishops, arranged a series of conferences.

Many important matters of administration were decided at these meetings with the leaders in a country which counts a million and a quarter Catholics. It was decided to erect three regional seminaries, two in the north, one for the Dominican Missions and one for the Paris Missions.
