

Sisters of St. Joseph Hold First Ceremony In New Mother House

The new Nazareth Normal School building located in East Avenue Pittsford, is now being occupied by the Sisters of St. Joseph of the Rochester community, who plan to utilize it for the first public ceremony in the new mother house of the order.

The building is large enough to house five hundred sisters at one time, and has a large chapel, a hospital, reception and class rooms.

One wing will be occupied by the sisters of the order, and the other wing by the novitiates. On the first floor there are class rooms and laboratory facilities.

The school has its own hospital located on the fourth floor of the north wing, completely equipped and provided with a small operating room.

Several years ago the sisters purchased the land, which extends from East Avenue nearly to Monroe Avenue as the future site of their mother house.
