Death At Congress Of Noted Prelate And Aged Priest

(By Radio to N.C.W.C.News Service) Sydney, Australia, Sept. 3. - The many distinguished ecclesiastics and laymen gathered here for the Twenty-ninth International Eucharistic Congress have learned with sorrow of the deaths within the last few days of two distinguished Australian

The priests who have just died are the Rt. Rev. Monsignor Thomas Francis Bourke, Vicar General of the Diocese of Rockhampton, who collapsed here Sunday, and the Rev. Thomas Kelsh, the oldest Australian born priest.

Monsignor Bourke, the son of Irish parents, made his ecclesiastical studies at St. Patrick's College, Manly, from which the great Eucharistic Procession, the brilliant climay of the present Congress, will begin next Sunday afternoon. He became parish priest of Townsville, Queensland, in 1902. a post he long held. The Holy Father created him a Domestic Pret ate in 1915

Foch Tablet Placed In Church Which He Attended During War

.Paris, Sept. 3 .- While the nation has recently erected a statute of Marshal Foch on a hill dominating Flanders' fields, from which Foch guided the battle of his troops during the winter of 1914, the parishioners of the Cassel parish church have com memorated the fact that between October, 1914, and June, 1915, the great general often

came to their church to pray. They have placed in the church a tablet bearing the following inscription.

"The parishioners of Our Lady of Cassel, in testimony of their veneration and gratitude toward Marshal Foch, who frequently entered this shrine to invoke the God of Hosts, and who spoke these memorable words:'It is your church which won the victory,' join their prayers for the repose of his son, Germain Foch, who died for France, August 22,1914,and his son-in-law, Paul Becourt, who died August 22, 1914, at Mercyle-Hant.

The son of Marshal Foch was only 24 and was a student__ officer. His son-in-law, an officer was 33. They fell in the same battle, in Lorraine, near the Belgian frontier.
