Dr. Kober Resigns As Georgetown U. Dean Of Medicine

Washington, Sept. 21.—Dr. George M. Kober has resigned as active dean of the Georgetown University School of Medicine here, a post he has held for 27 years, the Rev. W. Coleman Nevils, S. J., president of the university, has announced. Dr. Kober has been named dean emeritus of the medical school and a member of the university's board of regents. A successor has not yet been named. Dr. Kober submitted his resignation to the Rev. Charles W. Lyons, S. J., until recently president of Georgetown, who accepted it only after Dr. Kober had expressed his desire to relinquish the post because of his advancing years. He is 73 years old. Father Nevils, upon succeeding Father Lyons as president, tendered Dr. Kober a place on the board of regents and named him dean emeritus. In paying a fine tribute to Dr. Kober as a physician and educator, Father Nevils said his appointment to the board of regents was in "recognition and appreciation of his loyal record of service in behalf of his

alma mater." He has spent 38 years as a professor and as dean at the medical school, from which he was graduated in 1873.
