**Bishop Plagens Dedicates New Detroit Church**  
Detroit, Oct. 26. — In the presence of 5,000 persons, the Rt. Rev. Joseph C. Plagens, auxiliary bishop of Detroit, Sunday dedicated the new \$500,000 St. Florian's Church at Hamtramck. A score of diocesan clergy, assisted in the dedication ceremony, which followed a procession participated in by 1,500 members of parish and fraternal organizations, city officials, acolytes, flower girls and school children, led by Mayor Rudolph G. Tenerowicz.  
After the formal dedication, chanted at the church entrance, Bishop Plagens pontificated at solemn high Mass. Three thousand attended the Mass and hundreds more followed the service on the steps and in the streets outside.  
The Rev. Albert Zadala, pastor of Assumption parish, served as deacon; the Rev. Frank A. Baweja, of St. Hyacinth's parish, as sub-deacon; and the Rev. William C. Murphy, of St. David's parish, master of ceremonies at the dedication. Bishop Plagens, who was pastor of St. Florian's from 1910 to 1919, praised the congregation for the completion of the project begun during his pastorate.  
At the high Mass, the Rev. John Cook was arch-priest, the Rev. S. S. Skrzycki, deacon, and the Rev. Anthony Majewski, subdeacon.

**Anglican Synod In Ontario Hears Divorce Scored**  
North Bay, Ontario, Oct. 26.—Of interest to Catholics, not only in Canada but in the United States, were the deliberations of the Anglican Synod of Ontario just held here. Among the matters discussed were matrimony and divorce.  
The Synod went on record as approving the principle that ecumenism should give instructions regarding "the holy state of matrimony."  
A motion which would have committed the Synod to a solemn protest against the setting up of divorce courts in Ontario was referred to the Provincial Council. The Synod, however, adopted the clause in the council's report dealing with the subject of divorce and suggesting that, in view of the possibility that divorce courts would be established in Ontario, the council should be instructed to consider the matter so "in the event of a change of the voice of the Church should be heard."  
During the discussion Bishop Roper, of Ottawa, declared that the Church of England in Canada "does not know divorce and does not sanction divorce." Some steps should be taken, he urged, to keep before the people the high ideals of marriage which they had inherited. Marriage was a life-long union of one man with one woman, to the exclusion of all others, and there could be no question of the stand of the Church on the matter. "Temporary marriage cannot be accepted, as a marriage at all," he declared. "There can be no debate about it."
