Catholic Attorney
Who Devoted Life
To Aiding Poor Dies

London, Jan. 18.—William Cassell Maude, an attorney who devoted much of his life to the uplifting of the poor, has died at Bournemouth. He was a recognized authority on poor law and was the author of the following works: "The Religious Rights of the Catholic Poor," "The Justice's Handbook on Evidence" and "Settlement and Irremovability of the Poor." He was joint author of "The Law as to the Custody of Children," "The Assessment and Rating Manual" and "Contracts of Local Authorities."
He was 78 years old. His wife is well known as Sophie Maude, author of many Catholic and historical novels.
The funeral took place from the Church of the Sacred Heart, Bournemouth.


