## Caiholic Open Forum Held At Elizabeth, N. J.


Elizabeth, N. J., Feb. 26.-Taking advantage of the interest in Catholicism stimulated by the last presidential campaign, the Federated Holy Name Societies of Union County, New Jersey, comprising some 26 parish units centering about this city, is offering to its members and their non-Catholic friends on each Sunday afternoon during Lent in Open forum program. The programs are given in St. Mary's schol auditorium, and thus far have attracted large audiences.

The Rev. William I. Lonergan, S. J., of the America staff is the forum speaker. Under the general topic. 'The Modern Indictment of Catholicism," Father Lonergan is treating of the follwing questionss, "Is the Church Intolerant?" "Is the Church Arrogant?" "Is the Church un-Amercan?" 

## MARSHAL FOCH, IN SHADOW OF DEATH, SENDS FOR PRIEST

Paris, Feb. 27 .- Desperately ill with a complication of aliments and his condition varying after a real crisis last night, Marshal Ferdinand Foch, Generalissimo of the Allied Armies in the World War, today called to his bedside Father L'Hande a famous preacher and a member of the Society of Jesus to which the soldier's brother, Fr. Germain Foch, belongs.

Marshal Foch, Father L'Hande revealed following his visit, had been worried because his brother had not come to his bedide in response to his call, being unaware that Father Foch is confined to his bed by illness at Montpellier.

"The two," said the priest-visitor, "are like twins. Both are born, aggressive leaders, but whereas one has won fame by battling, with armies and often against other man, the other has waged the war of religion against iniquity."

When asked what he and the Marshal discussed, Father L'Hande added, is the strength of the Marshal, whose brain he found to be work-ing at "full speed," despite the infirmities that had attacked his body.


