J. Arthur Haley, business manager of athletics at Notre Dame, is arranging to handle a capacity crowd at Friday's game and will install special seats for the occasion.

Notre Dame, Ind., March 5.—Nearly 20 teams and more than 200 track and field athletes will seek team and individual honors in the third annual renewal of the Central Conference championships which are to be held in the gymnasium of the University of Notre Dame next Saturday morning and afternoon.

Coach John P. Nicholson, who with Manager Fred Schoppman of Notre Dame is directing all arrangements for the meet, believes that 1929 assemblage of athletes will be the greatest on record for the annual championships. Last year 175 athletes competed in the games and 159 have already been entered for this year's competition.

Mexican Revolt Spreads; Rebels Claim 10 States

Mexico City, March 5.—Federal forces were being consolidated today by Provisional President Emilio Portes Gil to crush the rebellion which broke out in Mexico, Sunday, and is reported to be spreading. The government admitted today that three states had joined in the rebellion, Vera Cruz, Sonora and Coahuila.

Insurgents were reported marching against Mexico City from Vera Cruz, 200 miles distant. All reports declare that religious troubles had little if anything to do with the revolt, which was believed to be in support of the independent candidacy of Gilberto Valencia for the Presidency.

Chapultepec Castle today was the scene of martial activities, with President Portes Gil holding frequent conferences with military leaders and members of his cabinet.

Nogales, Ariz., March 5.—In a manifesto issued yesterday, Gov. Fausto Topete of Sonora set aside the Mexican religious laws and announced that henceforth ministers of all religions would be permitted to hold services in their respective churches without restraint.

Until a new revolutionary government could be set up, Gov. Topete said, the religious problem could be solved by establishing a "freedom of conscience" and noninterference by the government in religious matters.
