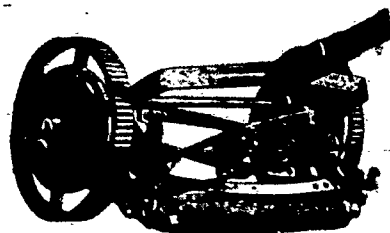

Knights of Columbus Seek 7,500 Columbus Club Members

Campaign Launched and Approved by Bishop O'Hern Conducted Throughout the City—Girls, Boys, Men, Women Sought

The Rochester Knights of Columbus and the officials of the Columbus Club are in the midst of a great campaign for 7,500 new members. The campaign was formally opened and heartily approved by Bishop O'Hern and has been in progress for two weeks now, with good results in many of the parishes.

John J. McInerney, past Grand Knight of the Rochester Knights of Columbus, and the man who first envisioned the construction of the splendid new Columbus Building, corner Chestnut and Lawn Street, is chairman of the campaign. Bishop O'Hern graciously accepted the office of Honorary Chairman. In accepting the office of Honorary Chairman and in opening the campaign, Bishop O'Hern said:

"We are told on all sides that family life is breaking down. If this is the truth, then we have a great need for big civic centers such as the Columbus Building affords. We need a family home on a larger scale, where men and women, boys and girls of the families may come together and keep up the traditions of the family circle. We need a place where in a wholesome environment and from which all may have happier and better for having entered and par-

taken of the advantages afforded."

Speaking of the Knights of Columbus, the Bishop-elect said: "God bless the Knights of Columbus. Thank God for what they have done and will do in this country and elsewhere. It is but a short time ago that a small body of clergy and laymen met in New Haven for the beginning of this Order which now spreads throughout the country and far beyond the sea. The K. of C. have stood ready at all times, especially in a national crisis, to be the strong right arm of the Church and country. Their work during the World War is well known."

Bishop O'Hern is most anxious that the campaign be a great success. Many teams of workers are active in all parishes. Boys and girls for the athletic club, men and women likewise, and men for the Knights of Columbus itself are being sought for membership. The Columbus Building as Bishop O'Hern truly says, has a wholesome environment, and it is hoped the campaign for new members will be a great success, meeting fully the quota of 7,500 that has been fixed, and meeting fully the hopes and expectations of the generous men whose financial backing made possible the erection and completion of this beautiful welfare building for the city of Rochester, under the auspices of the Knights of Columbus.
