The councils, on that day, will combine for the annual reception of Holy Communion by their members. The Most Rev. Archbishop Edward J. Hanna will preside, and the Rt. Rev. Robert Armstrong, Bishop of Sacramento will preach.

Archbishop Hanna will be the guest of honor at the Communion breakfast, and the Knights will pay him fitting honor, District Deputy Edward F. Jones of San Francisco will be the toastmaster, and the event will be one of the largest of the kind ever held by Knights of Columbus in the history of the Order.

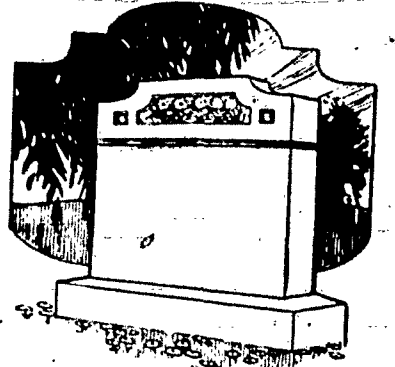
The proceeds from the fair will be used to entertain the 40,000 Elks who will come to Rochester for the annual convention of the New York State Elks' Association in June.
