First Superior of Monastery Dies

Detroit, March 21.—The Rev. Ignatius Ullrich, 81 years old, a member of the Order of Minor Capuchins for 44 years, died recently in Bonaventure Monastery. Funeral services were held Wednesday, with burial in Mt. Elliott Cemetery.

When St. Bonaventure Monastery was founded in 1884, Father Ullrich became its first superior. He served the monastery in that capacity on four occasions for a total of 13 years and was similarly engaged at other monasteries of the order for 20 years more. He retired five years ago.

Father Ullrich was born in Tuttle, Germany, and came to the United States when a boy. He entered the Order of Minor Capuchins in 1870, at Mount Calvary, Wis., and

The purpose of this new society is to unite the best amateur actors of the city in one organization to stage clean plays.

The first production here will be the play "Redemption." This is the same play which had such a marvelous success at the Catholic Convention of the State of Minnesota in September 1927.

K. C. Council At Holy Cross

New Haven, Conn., March 21.—Holy Cross College at Worcester, Mass., is to have its own Knights of Columbus council. The new council, which has been assigned the number 2706, was instituted Sunday with an insurance membership of 135, and an additional half dozen associate members.

Other "college councils" of the Knights of Columbus function at Notre Dame University, Villanova, Mt. St. Mary's College at Emmitsburg, Md., and St. Edwards University at Austin, Texas.

The new council will be unique in that every one of its members will be a new member of the Order.

Magr. Stephen Butler Dies.—San Antonio, Texas, March 21.—Rt. Rev. Stephen Butler, vicar general of the Diocese of Sioux City, Iowa, is dead here. Magr. Butler, who was 61 years old, came to San Antonio for his health last November and was thought to be improving. Magr. Butler was pastor of St. Joseph's Church, Carroll, Ia.

Holy Father Urges Faithful To Take Part in Congregational Singing

Rome, March 21.—Urging the people to take an active part in church worship and to learn the chants as well that they may join in the singing during services, as formerly was the custom everywhere, Pope Pius XI has made important recommendations accompanying an Apostolic Constitution on Liturgy, Gregorian Chant and Sacred Music, just issued. The Apostolic Constitution, prepared on the twenty-fifth anniversary of the motu proprio of Pope Pius X, was published in the latest issue of Acta Apostolicae Sedis.

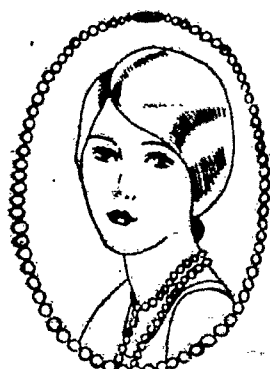
