

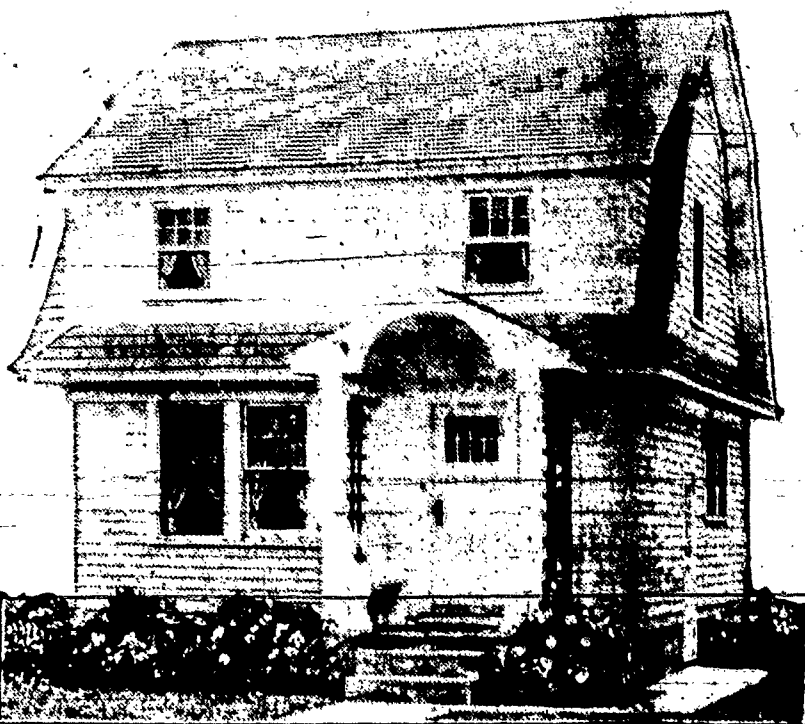

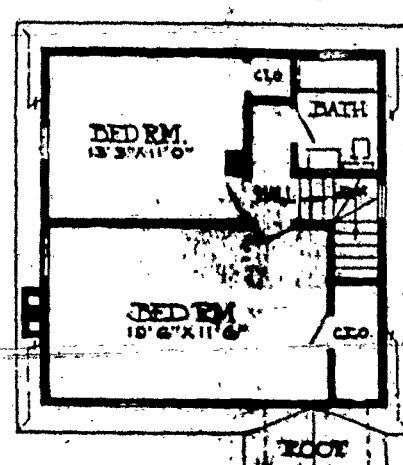

trellis over which vines or flowers can be trained are features which will appeal to the prospective home builder.

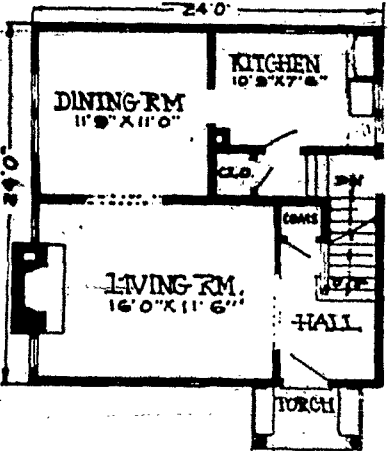

In many of the smaller towns and on the farm there is a demand for a small home such as shown in the illustration. On larger farms this would make a very excellent tenant house, while for the use of those who live in town, it is an excellent design for the small lot or for the family of not more than five people.

The house is 24 feet by 24 feet. Its foundation walls are straight, which means economical construction cost. The plain walls of the square house

are broken by unusual roof design. ly one. The kitchen is of good size, being 7 feet 6 inches by 10 feet 0 inches. Upstairs there are two large bedrooms, the one at the front of the house being 10 feet 6 inches by 11 feet 6 inches. The one at the rear is 13 feet 3 inches long by 11 feet deep. Both rooms have ample closet space in connection with them. At the head of the stairs off the hall is the bathroom.

This house is set on a concrete foundation and has a basement of the same size as the house itself. It is of frame construction, the outside walls being covered with ship-lap siding.

This home building design will appeal to those who want a small attractive home, but who do not have a large amount of money to invest in one.

Charge Mexico Has Too Many Churches Refuted In Address

Kansas City, April 3.—Dr. Thomas E. Purcell, speaking before the student body of St. Teresa's College, made reply to charges that small Mexican towns have been made to erect and maintain a large number of churches disproportionate to the number of their inhabitants. The number of churches, he said, has been exaggerated and many of those now in existence were founded and endowed by the Spanish Government.

Dr. Purcell's talk was given in the course of a study of the Encyclical of Pope Leo XIII on "The Condition of Labor," being held at the college in response to the request of the Department of Social Action of the National Catholic Welfare Conference.

Rev. A. G. Stieg Rector Of Southern Seminary

New Orleans, April 4.—The Rev. A. G. Stieg, S. V. D., former assistant superior of St. Augustine's Mission House and Seminary at Bay St. Louis, Miss., has been named by the officials of the Society of the Divine Word to fill the unexpired term of the Rev. Matthew Christman, S. V. D., rector, who died recently. St. Augustine's Seminary was established by Father Christman for the exclusive use of colored students for the priesthood.

Redemptorist Order Changes Announced

Esopus, N. Y., April 4.—The Most Rev. Patrick Murray, Superior General of the Congregation of the Most Holy Redeemer, has just announced an important change affecting the Redemptorists in Canada. The Ruthenian Vice-Province, established in the Dominion on Aug. 2, 1913, and until the present time dependent on the Belgian Province, has been transferred to the Toronto Province.

For more than fifteen years Belgian Redemptorists have been working among the Ruthenian Catholic Uniates in Canada, adopting their rite and language. This change, however, does not affect the status of the Ruthenian Vice-Province in Poland, which still remains under the jurisdiction of the Belgian Province.

Mexican Persecution Denounced in Hungary

Budapest, April 4.—The Hungarian Senate has approved the proposal of the Committee on Foreign Affairs that the government take cognizance of the petition presented by various cities and provinces urging unanimous condemnation of the persecution of Catholics in Mexico. The petition also urges the Hungarian Government to present the matter before the League of Nations.

Montreal Pastor Favors Publicity

Montreal, April 4.—Father Gerald McShane, pastor of St. Patrick's Church, advocates the use of modern publicity by churches. "You cannot run a church on prayers alone," he says; "you must have revenue."

DIocese PLANS DRIVE TO AID NEAR EAST IN RELIEF WORK

Nation-wide Appeal Will be Made By Catholics on April 21 for Important Work—Rochester Diocese Will Help Campaign Succeed

Plans for the participation of the Diocese of Rochester in the third annual membership roll-call of the Catholic Near East Welfare Association are now being formulated in parishes of this diocese. This roll call will be held on April 21st, and Rt. Rev. John Francis O'Hara, D.D., Bishop of Rochester, has given his hearty endorsement to the work. Particular interest attaches to the third roll call which is sponsored by Pope Pius XI, since it marks the 50th anniversary of the elevation of His Holiness to the priesthood. As in former years funds collected through the appeal will be placed at the disposal of Pope Pius, who directs their disbursement throughout the world in accordance with a six-fold program of philanthropic effort. Relief, welfare, education, international peace, religious harmony and worldwide charities are the benefactors of "The Holy Father's Community Chest," through which American Catholic contributions to this cause are distributed.

Holy Name Essay Contest Awards Sought by 5,937

New York, April 4.—Forty-four states, Canada, Alaska and Panama were represented in the Essay Contest conducted by the National Headquarters of the Holy Name Society, here. The contest was open to eighth grade and high school pupils. A total of 5,937 essays were submitted by contestants representing 872 schools. The final judges are: the Rt. Rev. John J. McMahon, D. D., Bishop of Trenton; the Rt. Rev. James P. Turner, spiritual director of the Philadelphia Archdiocesan Holy Name Union, and Rev. Peter L. Tretor, director of the Baltimore Section of the Baltimore Archdiocesan Union.

Belgian Priests Place Embargo on Jazz Steps

Brussels April 4.—Priests of the Ardennes district have persuaded the village mayors to suppress modern dances of the kind imported from America. Maids and men of the highlands are once more turning to the dances that were the delight of their ancestors before the jazz age.

Irish Academy Given \$100,000

Dublin, April 3.—A program from Melbourne, Australia, announces that the late Mr. Justice Higgins, of Australia, has bequeathed 25,000 to the Royal Irish Academy for the encouragement of research in Irish literature and the publication of old Irish manuscripts. The Royal Irish Academy has as an immediate body of old Irish manuscripts, which are at the disposal of any scholar of Irish, no matter what may be his track or country. One of the most eminent workers on these manuscripts is Father Lambert McKenna, S. J., of Rathfarham, Dublin, who has already published hundreds of Irish poems of the period known as Middle Irish. Father McKenna is working at several further translations which will be published in due course. He is also collecting various readings of the same poems, which he will publish in the forthcoming year. The Council of the Academy has been engaged for many years in the publication of a dictionary of the Irish language. The dictionary, which is now complete, will be published in three volumes by Judge Higgins. Owing to the fact that the Academy is in the possession of a library of Irish manuscripts, the Irish Dictionary will be more and more work on the part of the Academy.
