

Sister M. Sebastian, Principal of School Buried at Hornell

Beloved Teacher, Head of St. Ann's Parochial School, Victim of Pneumonia—Hundreds at Funeral

Hornell, April 4.—The funeral of Sister M. Sebastian, principal of St. Ann's Parochial School in this city for many years, was held in St. Ann's Church at 9 o'clock last Monday morning. It was attended by all of the children of the school, by hundreds of friends and by a large number of priests. Sincere tribute was paid to this greatly beloved Sister of Mercy, and she will be greatly mourned in the community.

Sister M. Sebastian before her entrance into sisterhood was Miss Teresa Curry, daughter of the late Michael and Mary Curry of Batavia. Her early life was spent in Batavia, but for the past 35 years she had lived here and in Corning. Of that time, 30 years had been spent in Hornell in her death the parish loses its second faithful worker in a period of less than two weeks.

Sister M. Sebastian entered the Mother House of Mercy in Batavia in November, 1894, and after three years of study and preparation made her first profession of vows in this city in August, 1897. She remained here a few years as an instructor in the parochial school, after which she was transferred to Corning, where she served for about five years. She was then returned to Hornell, where she remained until her death.
