Nazareth Students Give Bishop A Great Welcome And Present Purse to Him

First Official Visit to Academy by Bishop O'Hern is Occasion for Rousing Greeting by Entire Student Body—Thousand Girls, in White Veils, Make Beautiful Spectacle

Nazareth Academy gave a great welcome to Rt. Rev. John Francis O'Hern, D. D., Bishop of Rochester, on Thursday afternoon this week. When the Bishop made his first visit to the Academy since his consecration, a purse of gold was presented to the Bishop, an appropriate program of welcome carried out, and the Bishop officiated at Pontifical Benediction. The entire student body and teaching staff of Sisters of St. Joseph greeted Bishop O'Hern on his arrival at the school at 2.30 o'clock. The reception to the Bishop was held in the Auditorium, which was filled to capacity. The students sang "He Est Sacerdos" as the Bishop entered. An address of welcome, and presentation of the purse of gold, was made by Josephine Koch, a half of the Academy. Bishop O'Hern responded gratefully and graciously. Sunday April 21.—St. Anselm, Archbishop, of Canterbury. His episcopate was a constant struggle with the Kings William Rufus and Henry I, chiefly over the question of investitures. He introduced the Feast of the Immaculate Conception to the West. He died in 1109. Monday, April 22.—St. Soter, Pope, martyr, was raised to the Chair of Peter on the death of St. Anicetus in 173. He governed the Church until the year 177 and was distinguished for his aims giving aid for his opposition to the heresy of Montanus. Tuesday, April 23.—St. George, Patron of England. He was a tribune under Diocletian and rebuked the Emperor for persecuting the Christians. For this he was cruelly tortured and finally beheaded. Wednesday, April 24.—St. Fidelis of Sigmaringen, a rich and noble lawyer, entered the Capuchin Order. He preached against the Calvinists in Switzerland and after a sermon at Sevis was attacked and killed. Thursday, April 25.—St. Mark, Evangelist, was converted by St. Peter whom he afterward accompanied to Rome as secretary and interpreter. He founded the Church in Alexandria. After governing his see for years he was seized by the heathens and killed. Friday, April 26.—Sts. Cletus and Marcellinus, Popes, martyrs. Cletus was the third bishop of Rome, reigning from 76 to 89. Marcellinus succeeded to the papacy in 296 in the time of Diocletian. Saturday, April 27.—St. Zita, virgin, was a servant of a citizen of Lucca. She fed the poor and by her gentleness overcame the jealousy of her fellow servants. When she died in 1272 a bright star appeared over her grave to show that she had gained eternal rest.

Bishop O'Hern Will Officiate and Will Preach—Italian Consular Agent and Other Distinguished Citizens Co-Operating in Celebration of Sovereignty of Vicar of Christ

A solemn Pontifical "Te Deum" will be sung in St. Patrick's Cathedral at 7.45 o'clock this Sunday evening, April 21st, in thanksgiving for the Concordat between the Holy See and the Kingdom of Italy, recognizing the sovereignty of the Vicar of Christ.

The Rt. Rev. John Francis O'Hern, D.D., Bishop of Rochester, will officiate and will preach the sermon of the occasion. Many priests and a great congregation of the laity will be present, and there will be special music by the Cathedral Choir. Assisting Bishop O'Hern in arranging for the event are the Italian Consular Agent, Cesare Sconfetti and a special committee of which Harry C. D'Annunzio is president; Cosmo A. Cilano, treasurer and Anthony Miceli, secretary. It is expected that St. Patrick's Cathedral will be filled to capacity for the event.
