



Put Furring on Inside

to Keep Cellar Dry To appreciate the difficulties of making any kind of a masonry wall dampboof, it is necessary to understand that actual dampness does not penetrate these walls so much as the cold. When the walls are cold condensation gathers on them and we then have what appears to be dampness coming through them. To avoid this

we make the walls coldprost. This is done by applying furring on the inside walls as a base for the inth and plaster. This is a sound type of construction.

Clean Varnished Floor To clean a properly varnished floor wipe it with a civili dampened in lukewarm water. It is unnecessary to scrub, scald, oil or soap a varnished floor to keep it clean. Its hard surface will not permit dirt to reach and impregnate the wood.

When a varnished floor begins to show the effects of hard wear-once a year or oftener, if negessary-sandpaper it lightly and nut off a new cost. The habit of doing this every spring in city and country houses and in office buildings preserves the fresh,
