## New York Organ Under Sidewalk In Concrete Pit

St. Malachy's Church Has Only Organ in the World Installed in This Manner

New York City, May 16.—A new \$12,800 organ was dedicated Sunday evening in the Actors' Chapel of St. Malachy's Roman Catholic Church, Forty-ninth Street, just west of Broadway. The organ is installed under the sidewalk and street, and the tone comes into the chapel, which is under the main church auditorium, through vents at the rear of the chapel. This is believed to be the only organ in the world so installed. This space-saving arrangement was made because of the large crowds of theatrical people who attend the actors' mass at 12:15 o'clock each Sunday.

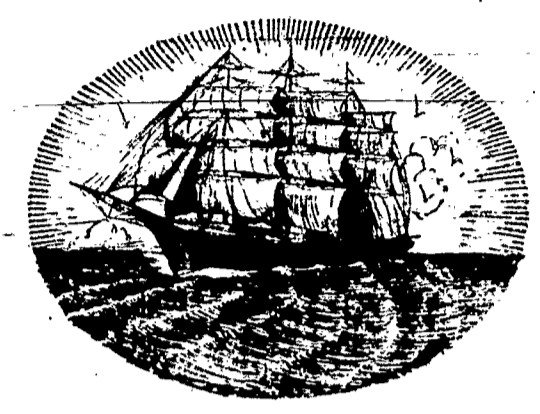
The concrete pit in which the organ stands was specially constructed during the recent extension of the church building. The walls and ceiling are covered with hard plaster treated acoustically.

The organ was dedicated to Mgr. John P. Chidwick, representing Cardinal Hayes. After the blessing Pietro A. Yon, organist of St. Patrick's Cathedral, gave a recital.
