Rome, May 24.—According to
 Lavoro Fascista, it is almost certain
 that the Vatican City will have its
 own aviation field.
 The journal points out that the
 installation of an airport is import-
 ant from a juridical point of view
 since it would permit freedom of
 communication with the outside
 world, lack of which was thought by
 many to be an obstacle to the settle-
 ment of the Roman question. Here-
 tofore it had been conceded gener-
 ally that the settlement would neces-
 sitate granting to the Holy See a strip
 of land giving access to the sea.

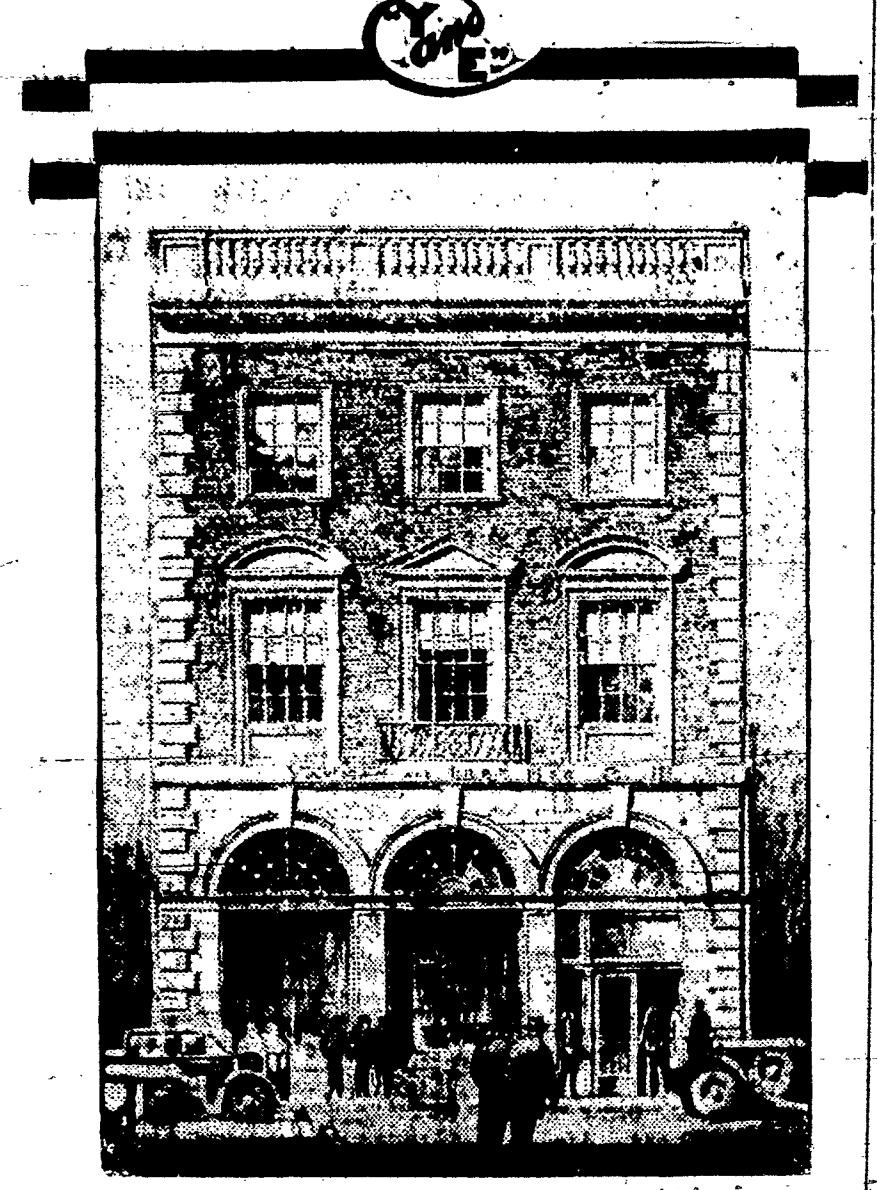

Rev. Fathers Hofschneider and Edel-
 man Spoke on Tribute to Mother
 Living and Dear

Dansville, May 23.—Mother's Day
 was observed in a special way at St.
