UTHOR OF MANY BOOKS AND GIFTED CRITIC

Was Editing Catholic Dictionary When He Died-Wrote Much for Magazines

New York City, May 29 .- Conde Benoist Pallen, editor-and publisher of the Catholic Encyclopedia, noted critic, editor and publisher, and one of the best-known writers on Catholic subjects in America, died at his home in this city last Sunday, and was buried on Tuesday from St. Ignatius Loyola Church, with a solemn high Mass of requiem. His funeral was attended by dignitaries of the Church, many priests and a large number of friends, including people famous in the editorial and literary world.

Attorney Philip H. Donnelly of gle to maintain human rights on the Priday on "The Mexican Situation" all forms of religion. under the auspices of Elmira Council, Knights of Columbus. Judge Donnelly said the intervention by the United States in the Carranza-Huerta dispute 15 years ago caused the present embarrassing condition whereby this country is defending Calles, who has not the backing of a majority of his own people, and who is trying to force unjust and un-American laws upon his people at the point of the bayonet.

The proper policy for the United States in the present Mexican trouble is "hands off," Judge Donnelly said. By upholding the Calles regime, the United States is aiding in establishing religious policies which will also continue his duties as are in direct contrast to the American Constitution which grants religious freedom, he declared.
