## German and U. S. Aims Harmonize, Canon Declares

Slogan of Rev. Dr. Kaas, Center Party Head, Enthusiastically Indorsed

Cologne, May 29.—"With America's new friendliness toward America" is the slogan of the Rev. Dr. Kaas, Chief of the Center party and recently elected head of the Center party, according to an interview recently published in the Vienna New Free Press and the title "Germany's Crossroad in Foreign Affairs."

In the opinion of the Vienna editor, Dr. Kaas' idea is shared by all German Catholics and many non-Catholics as well.

"The political crossroad at which Germany finds herself today," Dr. Kaas is quoted as saying, "is principally the result of the war lost by the former government. Her only route was to put into the service of her political, economical and moral regeneration the idea of European reconciliation."

"Her relations with France center about the problems of political security, reparation and, above all, liquidation of the war debt."

"The problem of political security is in good hands as shown by the policy adopted by Minister Stresemann. The reparation problem can only be solved by conservation of the vital forces of German economy together with the new economical development. In this sense we must work with America, never against America."

With regard to the Soviet Government, Dr. Kaas feels that Germany and Moscow must establish relations for the good of the future, since "there must be a bridge between East and West, and Germany, without condoning or imitating the behavior of Russian rulers, must be that bridge. But Germany, impoverished and disturbed by internal social struggles, can not alone do her duty in stamping out Bolshevism."

In discussing the Pan-German question, the head of the Center party says:

"All too German parties desire union with Austria, but the problem of new Austria is not merely Austrian, or German, but European because of that it can be solved only by European agreement. The people of our generation must be ready but waiting until history will call upon us to unite and the destiny of Germany and Austria shall be one."

## School For Boys At Notre Dame Is Discontinued

Notre Dame, Ind., May 24.—Discontinuation of St. Edward's School for Boys and remodeling of its present building into a residence hall for University of Notre Dame students has just been announced by the Rev. Thomas A. Steiner, C. S. C., chairman of the building committee of the University.

Known throughout the country as a school for youths under the age of fourteen, St. Edward's has always been connected with Notre Dame. Until 1921, both high school and grammar school students were trained at St. Edward's but in that year the high school department was discontinued.

Upon the completion of the 1929 school year, carpenters will begin their work of remodeling the building. It will be formed into a modern dormitory, capable of housing 200 students. Notre Dame students of all four classes will be housed in the dormitory, and it is expected that the new arrangement will reduce the number of students who live in South Bend to less than 400.

The Catholic dean of the Diplomatic Corps in the United States made this announcement in the course of an address to the literary political societies of Princeton University recently.

The ability to create, even in a humble way, is one of the greatest sources of satisfaction and contentment, the Ambassador said, adding: "You young people of America and also our young people in England can add much to your own happiness and also the happiness of the world generally if you will learn not only to appreciate beautiful things but also to create them within the measure of your capacity."

London, May 29.—Dr. Maria Montessori, world-renowned educator, who is opening a personally conducted center for the training of teachers and governesses here, has just been given an official welcome by London in the Central Hall, Westminster.

It contains three rooms and the sun-porch on the first floor and four bedrooms and bath on the second floor.

The room arrangement is very similar to the colonial, as the entrance hall is in the center of the house with the living room on one side and the dining room and kitchen on the other. The living room extends the depth of the house, 22 feet, and is 11

feet 3 inches wide. It has an open fireplace in the center of the outside wall and at one side are double french doors opening into a sun porch which is 7 feet wide and 22 feet deep. To the left through a cased opening is the dining room, a front corner room, 11 feet 3 inches by 12 feet. At the back is a good sized kitchen and off it a breakfast nook.

The stairs to the second floor run out of the central entrance hall and end in a central hall on the second floor. Each of the bedrooms open off the hall and is a corner room. They all are of practically the same size. The bathroom is at the end of the hall at the front.

This is a very fine building design. It should have plenty of ground surrounding it as the lower portion of the home being of brick gives an air of size. Planted as shown, in the illustration any owner may be proud of this home.

**Bedrooms Should Be of Ample Proportions**

Bedrooms need not be very large, but should have plenty of light and air, and should allow beds, dressers, chests of drawers and chairs to be placed without interfering with doors, windows or heating outlets.
