Catholic Club Camp Opens For Season On 29th of June

Announcement is made by the Catholic Women's Club that it will open its camp for girls on Canandaigua Lake on Saturday, June 29th. In speaking of the Camp, Mrs. Frank T. Curtin, president of the Club, said: "The policy adopted last season of registering Juniors from ten

years up proved so popular that the same program is laid out for this year. About 200 Juniors were entertained at the Camp last year, and there were not sufficient beds for all who desired to register. During August any girl or woman over fifteen will be welcomed, including mothers who are employed, with daughters over eight."

The affairs of the Camp will be administered this year by a committee composed of Mrs. John Gysel, Chairman; Mrs. Frank T. Curtin, Miss Cecelia M. Yawman, Mrs. M. H. Kough, Mrs. E. J. Rooney, Mrs. L. A. Whalen, Mrs. P. D. Kane and Mrs. Wendell E. Andrews. Miss Anne Dodge, who so capably managed the house last year, will again be in charge. The recreational program will be directed by Miss Muriel Abraham, assisted by a corps of camp counsellors.

In its physical aspects the Camp is conceded to be one of the beauty spots of the Finger Lake region. The "house" is situated on a plot of one and one-half acres with a shore line of 1,200 feet on the West Lake Road of Canandaigua Lake. Built for a country home, it has seated, paneled walls, open-air sleeping porches and dining room, electricity and modern plumbing. The Camp is the only one under Catholic supervision in this part of the State, the chapel of Our Lady of Lebanon on the Lake administering to its spiritual welfare.

Registrations are now being received at the Catholic Women's Club, 215 Alexander Street, for the entire season.
