particularly the mother, must provide a defense. On the heads of the family rests the responsibility for the preservation of the home spirit almost entirely, if not entirely. The time to safeguard the home begins on the very day of the marriage, and if its first development is not right it cannot grow and enlarge into the right kind of family circle. The first requisite the heads of a family must realize is that they are subjects of God Almighty. They are not their own masters even in their own home. Men and women must realize that their lives are a stewardship, not only for themselves, but also for those whom God entrusts to them, and so it is that no family can hold out against worldly assaults unless God and the spirit of religion be in that home. This it is that constitutes the basis of a happy home life.

"Show me the man and wife who reverence God, and I shall show you the nucleus of a happy home. Such a couple may not have high social position, but they will have the substantial peace which comes from knowing that they are friends of God. Such a couple are safe and secure in their family circles amid all the dangers of modern life. The trouble with some families is that the parents do not respect God or each other as they ought, and in consequence the children do not respect their parents. And so we assert the old it of faith will do more to restore the home to its proper place than all the countless means and contrivances which modern world-wide people can devise.

**Without Religion, Disruption**  
"To be sure, the best of homes, even with all the help which religion affords, will have its afflictions. But without religion, especially in these days, there is imminent danger of disruption.

"Home today, for many people, is but a wayside inn. The young, seeking distraction constantly without ever satisfying the quest, worry themselves out before their time. Home, which should be for us all the most attractive spot on earth, only too often becomes merely a stopping place, a boarding house at which they put up until they can start off again to worry themselves in the way that gives no refreshment or peace.

of priests who have been shot because they have said Mass there. It is a crime to hold a religious ceremony in a Mexican cemetery.

"All religious property in Mexico was stolen by the Calles group. They take it and give it to their own people. Suppose Alfred E. Smith, while governor of New York State, had seized all churches? Well, that is just what happened in Mexico. There are no church services, no marriage ceremonies there; no, not a church bell tolls.

**Great Wrongs Inflicted**  
"To put their regulations into effect, the Calles regime has been guilty of every known cruelty. They have resorted even to murder, murder of mere youths, simply and solely because they were Catholics and for no other reason. Upon others they have inflicted wrongs worse than death. Citizens are arrested, but no trial is had, no jury trial is accorded them. They are summarily sentenced and punishment inflicted, whether it be imprisonment or death.

"Throughout all these trials the Mexican people are exhibiting to the world a self-control that is calling forth the admiration of all peoples in all climes. They are consistently following the advice of the Catholic hierarchy and refraining from bloodshed and violence. They have instituted an economic boycott, and to date, more than three months since it began, it is just as effective as on the first day it was tried. This boycott is having telling effect and is driving some reason into the Calles regime. The main weapon, however, of the Catholics is prayer. This is the weapon urged by the Catholic hierarchy and by the Pope."

sophical subjects to the leading Catholic publications in this country.

Mr. Pallen was the author of the "Meaning of the Halls of the Kings," and treasured a letter from Lord Tennyson, who wrote that Mr. Pallen, of all his commentators, understood him best. He was engaged on the new Catholic Dictionary when he died. He wrote also "Philosophy of Literature," "Epochs of Literature," "What is Liberalism?" "The New Rubaiyat," a collection of poems and "Feast of Thalareus," a dramatic poem. "Death of Sir Launcelot and Other Poems," "Education of Boys," "Ghost House," "King's Coll," "Crucible Island" and "As Man to Man," novels.

Mr. Pallen is survived by a widow, the former Georgianna McDougall Adams, daughter of General John Adams, whom he married in 1836; four sons, Charles, Louis B. and Thomas A. Pallen of New York and Dr. Conde de Sales Pallen, of Rochelle Park, N. J., and five daughters, Mrs. De Witt Clinton Noyes of Sharon, Conn.; Mrs. R. W. Walker of Garden City, L. I., and the Misses Louise B., Anne Elizabeth and Frances Josephine Pallen of this city.

He was born in St. Louis on Dec. 5, 1858, the son of Dr. Montrose Anderson Pallen and the former Anne Elizabeth Benoit. He was descended from the Count Pallen of Russia, who, as a political refugee, after a series of captures and escapes in six countries of Europe, reached Virginia, where he founded the American family of that name. The body of Mr. Pallen was taken to St. Louis, Mo., for interment. Catholic literature has suffered a severe loss in his death. He exercised a far-reaching influence for good in the Catholic literary world, and his name and memory will not soon be forgotten.

**Archbishop Mostyn Made Malta Knight**

London, May 29.—The Archbishop of Cardiff, Msgr. Francis Mostyn, has been created a Knight of Honor and Devotion of the Sovereign Sacred Military Order of St. John of Jerusalem, whose members are generally styled Knights of Malta.

Admission to the English association of the order is based on proofs of noble birth. Archbishop Mostyn is able to show direct descent in the paternal line to a Mostyn entitled to armorial bearings at a date earlier than the year of King Henry VII's coronation—1487. A Knight of Malta must also be a Catholic, but a dispensation was granted by Pope Leo XIII in 1881 empowering King Edward VII (then Prince of Wales) to become a member of the order.
