The sermon will be delivered by Dr. George F. Kettell, S.T.D., professor at Nazareth College, Rochester. A reception in honor of Father Sullivan will be held at the home of his mother during the same afternoon. Father Sullivan is the elder son of Mrs. Anna Sullivan, Bath, and is the first member of St. Mary's Church, Bath, to be ordained a priest in the 76 years history of that parish. Father Sullivan attended Bath High School then entered St. Andrew's Seminary at Rochester, and for the past six years has been a student at St. Bernard's Seminary, that city.

### Treaties Are Ratified And the Vatican State Becomes a Reality

peared and the great bronze doors were swung open and the Papal sun was fired.  
Some Officials Named  
Announcement of the government of the Vatican City State in its new form followed on the heels of ratification.  
Official announcement was made that Mgr. Borgognini-Duca has been named first Papal Nuncio to Italy and will be made a titular Archbishop.

Professor Francesco Pacelli was named General Counselor to the Vatican City.  
Cardinal Serafini was confirmed in the Governorship with Bernardino Nogara as Treasurer and Camillo Beccari as Secretary-General to the Governor.

Mgr. Pizzardo replaces Mgr. Borgognini-Duca as Secretary of the Congregation of Extraordinary Ecclesiastical Affairs and his place is taken by Mgr. Ottoviani as Under-Secretary of State.  
There were several other changes in offices in conformance with these.

**Other Historic Events**  
The ratification of the Italian-Vatican treaty was not the first event of world importance in which the Vatican figured.

Pope Gregory VII, or Hildebrand, as he was called, was one of the greatest of the Roman Pontiffs. In his gigantic struggle to bring about reforms and to maintain the Papal independence against Henry IV of Germany, Pope Gregory injected a new life into the society of his day, and though he suffered banishment in the last years of his life, he laid the basis upon which the Church and Europe were to progress in ensuing years. Dying in exile in the castle of Salerno, Gregory's last words were: "I have loved justice and hated iniquity, therefore I die in exile."  
**Barbarossa and English King**  
The traditions established by Gregory found an able champion in

Alexander III, who was Pope toward the end of the 12th century. His pontificate was characterized by the heroic struggle against the Emperor Frederick Barbarossa, who sought to enslave the Papacy. Frederick's submission to the Pope followed his unconditional surrender in Venice in 1177.  
Alexander also compelled the English king to make amends for the murder of St. Thomas a Becket, defender of the independence of the Church, obtaining from the penitent monarch every right for which Becket had fought and died. The Pontiff's enforced exile in France contributed greatly to enhance the dignity of the Papacy, which, throughout its long history, has seemed never so popular as when in distress.

The attempts of the kings of France in the 14th and 15th centuries to dominate the Papacy resulted in the "Babylonian captivity" of the Popes in Avignon, one of the darkest periods in the history of the Church and of Europe. It was largely through the influence of St. Catherine of Siena that after an exile of seventy years or more, Boniface XIII, the last Pope to reside in Avignon, returned to Rome and began the vital reaction that restored the independence of the Popes.  
Another great Pontiff to suffer at the hands of an unscrupulous monarch was Pius VII, who was held prisoner by Napoleon Bonaparte, first in Rome and then at the palace of Fontainebleau near Paris. In pursuance of Napoleon's ambition to gather into his own hands both the political and spiritual authority of Europe, it was largely due to his humble, but firm, resistance, backed only by moral strength, that Napoleon failed to carry out his projects for the complete subjection of Europe. Pius spurned Napoleon's offer to restore the Papal states when the Emperor found himself threatened by the Allies who demanded liberation of the Pontiff and the restoration of his independence and temporal sovereignty. With their victories the captivity of the Papacy was once more at an end.

Parish Celebration Held in Church Auditorium, with Rev. William P. Ryan as Chief Speaker

Auburn, June 13.—The Rev. John A. Conway, rector of Holy Family Church in this city, completed 25 years of service in the priesthood on Tuesday of this week.  
Sunday evening a reception was tendered him by his parishioners and friends in the auditorium of the church, and a purse of \$2,500 was presented to him by John J. Leo, in behalf of his people. A great crowd was present at the reception, and a fine program was rendered.  
The principal address was delivered by Rev. William P. Ryan of St. Bernard's Seminary, Rochester. He paid a special tribute to Father Conway. Special music was given by the choir of the Holy Family Church, directed by James A. Hennessy, with Miss Katherine Plunkett, accompanist.  
Father Conway was born at Canandaigua and was graduated from St. Mary's parochial school and Canandaigua Academy. After completing his studies in St. Bernard's Seminary, Rochester, he was ordained to the priesthood June 10, 1904, by the late Right Rev. Bernard J. McQuaid.  
The first assignment of Father Conway was as assistant pastor at St. Mary's Church, Rochester. He also served as chaplain at Elmira Reformatory seven years. Later he organized a new parish at Corning

and was appointed pastor of Holy Family Church in Auburn in July, 1923. His work here has been very successful and he is greatly beloved by his people.
