A New Hospital For Children's Heart Disease

The Only Institution of the Kind Will Be Erected in Chicago Soon

Chicago, June 20.—A charity hospital specializing in children's heart disease cases, the only one of its kind in the country, is being built in Jackson Park, Chicago, on the site of the first World's Fair buildings. Dr. Robert A. Black, professor and director of the division of pediatrics at Loyola University, is to head the institution which will be known as the La Rabida Jackson Park Sanitarium. Construction on the \$300,000 project is to start at once.

The sanitarium will be housed in a building designed as a replica of the monastery in Pabos, Spain, known as La Rabida, where Columbus took refuge while planning the first voyage to the New World. The original La Rabida in the fall of 1492 was a gift from the queen of Spain.

Besides Dr. Black the staff will number among its members nationally known pediatricians, heart specialists and research technicians. The sanitarium is to treat nothing but heart disease in children and will provide an international research center for the study of the disease.

Within three or four years the sanitarium will be able to provide tentative data for the benefit of children all over the world. Twenty

St. Patrick's Cathedral Will Broadcast Sermons, But Not Ritual of Mass

Decision to Broadcast is Tribute to Msgr. Michael J. Lavelle, Rector of Cathedral and Fifty Years a Priest

New York, June 20.—Cardinal Hayes and the lay trustees of St. Patrick's Cathedral have determined to broadcast the sermons preached at the 11 o'clock High Mass every Sunday morning. This decision was announced Sunday as one of many tributes to Msgr. Michael J. Lavelle in connection with his completion on June 7 of fifty years in the priesthood.

The trustees of St. Patrick's Cathedral have had expert radio engineers test atmospheric conditions at the cathedral and the acoustics of its interior. From present prospects the regular broadcasting will not be started until the many improvements now going on in the cathedral, including the installation of three great new organs, are completed.

It is expected, however, that the broadcasting will be in progress long before the celebration of the golden jubilee of the dedication of the present cathedral next Spring.

Five thousand children were treated previous to 1924 when a change in policy limited the work of the institution to children's heart cases. Last year 550 children were treated with no mortality.

The ritual of the Mass itself will not be broadcast. Whether some of the music by the choir is to be broadcast will be decided in a few days.

The cathedral authorities are expecting to use WLWL, the station of the Paulist Fathers. The Paulists broadcast regularly their Sunday evening services and special services from the Paulist Church at Columbus Avenue and Sixtieth Street, but they have no franchise at present to use the air Sunday morning.

St. Patrick's will become the first Catholic cathedral and one of the few Catholic churches in America to broadcast regularly its Sunday morning sermons. In addition to WLWL there are smaller Catholic transmitting stations in St. Louis, Notre Dame University, Ind.; New Orleans and in Oregon.

The cathedral authorities feel that the broadcasting will be a source of comfort and profit to thousands of Catholic "shut-ins," and also that it will do much to clarify the Catholic doctrine and the Catholic attitude on current questions in the mind of non-Catholics.

Scholarship Established
St. Louis, June 20.—The St. Louis University School of Medicine has just announced the establishment of a scholarship fund by Sigmund Wolfert, department store official, to be known as the "Levi and Peppo Wolfert Scholarship in the School of Medicine of St. Louis University." The amount of the fund is \$8,000.

INVITATIONS SENT TO ALL SODALITIES

Hundreds of Acceptances Received—Purpose of the Convention

St. Louis, Mo., June 20.—The American Headquarters of Our Lady's Affiliated Sodalities announces that it has just completed plans for the first National Convention of Women Sodalists. The convention, a new project in Sodality history, is to open Friday morning, July 5, at the Palmer House, Chicago, and is to continue through some twelve sessions until the following Sunday night. Notices have already been sent to every parish in the United States, inviting the attendance of members of the Young Ladies' and Married Ladies' Sodalities, as well as of their pastors and directors. It is expected, from the enthusiastic responses already given, that attendance at the meeting will number over 800 Catholic women from all parts of the country.

June 21. Fifth Sunday after Pentecost. Green vestments. Mass is proper to the Sunday. Gloria, 2nd oration of all the Saints. (2nd found us). 3rd is left to the choice of the priest. Creed, Preface of the Trinity.

June 22. Monday: Feast of the Nativity of St. John the Baptist, with a Common Octave. Mass is proper to the feast. Gloria, Common preface.

June 23. Tuesday: Feast of St. William, White vestments. Mass is proper to the feast. Gloria, Commemoration of the Octave.

June 24. Wednesday: Feast of St. John and Paul, Red vestments. Mass is proper to the feast. Gloria, Commemoration of the Octave.

June 25. Thursday: The fourth Day within the Octave. Mass is proper to the feast of St. John the Baptist, Gloria, 2nd oration for all the Saints, 3rd for the Pope or the Church. A votive Mass is permitted.

June 26. Friday: Feast of Sts. Irenaeus and the Vigil of St. Peter and Paul, Mass is either: Proper to the feast (red vestments) with a Gloria, one commemoration of the Octave and one of the vigil, and the last Gospel of the Vigil or, Proper to the vigil (purple vestments) with one of the Octave.

June 27. Saturday: Feast of Sts. Peter and Paul, with a Common Octave. Mass is proper to the feast. Red vestments. Gloria and Creed, Preface of Apostles.

Good Building Design for Family That Wants Bungalow Type Home



Many people prefer the bungalow type of home because of its greater convenience and arrangement, all on a single floor. When treated as this house has been treated a charming exterior appearance is also achieved with a suggestion of coziness.


Not so many years ago there originated in California a home building design that has since become very popular all over the United States. The bungalow type of home is preferred by many people because of the convenience of its room arrangement, the rooms being all on one floor. The climate of California made this design popular because it could be constructed cheaply, there being no necessity for a basement to house the heating plant, neither was there need for a tight weather-proof house.

Architects in every section of the country have improved upon the California design and now many thousand bungalows have been built of this type. The bungalow type of home is preferred by many people because of the convenience of its room arrangement, the rooms being all on one floor. The climate of California made this design popular because it could be constructed cheaply, there being no necessity for a basement to house the heating plant, neither was there need for a tight weather-proof house.

This home is of frame construction and has a basement the same size as the house proper, 26 feet by 32 feet. Set into one end is the sun porch with two sets of french windows on each side and french windows on either side of the french door opening off the brick steps and platform. The first floor contains four rooms, a large living room 12 feet 6 inches by 13 feet, a dining room 11 feet 6 inches by 14 feet and kitchen 11 feet 6 inches by 10 feet 6 inches, also a bedroom 11 feet 6 inches by 12 feet. The two bedrooms upstairs are about 12 feet square.

This is a good home building design for the family who wants a bungalow type home but who needs more bedrooms than are usually found when only the first floor is utilized. When surrounded by lawn and plantings as shown in the illustration it makes a most attractive home.

To Give Height

When additional height is desired in low rooms, wall paper with stripes of rising lines in the pattern should be used. The paper should run directly to the ceiling line, and the ceiling should be papered with a plain color close to the shade of the background of the walls. If it is not too dark, so that the change from wall to ceiling will not be so marked.
