Sunday, July 21—St. Victor, martyr, was an officer in the army of the Emperor Maximian. Because of his perseverance in the faith and particularly because of his exhortations to the Christians of Marselles after the slaughter of the Theban Legion, he was put to death after a cruel and torturous.

Monday, July 22—St. Mary, Madonna, whose name is derived from a life of sin to take her place among the Saints of the Church. She was one of the family "when Jesus so loved" that he raised the brother, Lazarus from the dead. She stood with the blessed Virgin and St. John at the foot of the Cross. When the faith of the world was scattered by persecution, it was she who found refuge in a cave in Provence where she lived for thirty years.

Tuesday, July 23—St. Apollonia, bishop and martyr, was the first Bishop of Ravenna. He was a native of Asia Minor. He was a disciple of St. Peter.

Wednesday, July 24—St. Christina, virgin and martyr, was cruelly tortured because she refused some golden idols belonging to her father who was a rich and powerful pagan magistrate. She was miraculously preserved from death on several occasions but finally was martyred at Trier, a city which formerly stood on a island in the lake of Helson.

Thursday, July 25—St. James, Apostle, was one of the three chosen by the Father to be companions of Our Saviour. When he was accused and brought before Herod Agrippa, his fearless confession of Jesus so moved the public prosecutor that he released him. It is a Christian on the spot. Accused and accused were thrown upon both sides.

Friday, July 26—St. Anne, was chosen by God to become the mother of the Blessed Virgin. The Saint was advanced in age when Mary was born, the fruit of grace. San Quentin Chaplain Wins Sincere Praise

San Francisco, July 18.—A remarkable tribute to the Rev. William Fleming, chaplain of San Quentin Prison, is paid by "Bill" Bailey, veteran California newspaperman, in an article published in the Sausalito News.

In his article, Mr. Bailey calls attention to this statement by Father Fleming in his annual report to Gov. C. C. Young on prison conditions and crime in California:

"Some have tried to legislate morally into the people, but that social experiment has been, in regard to crime, a miserable failure."

The article applauds the bravery of Father Fleming in making this statement and then tells of Bailey's observation of Father Fleming's conduct of the office of Chaplain at the State Prison. Himself a non-Catholic, Mr. Bailey writes as follows:

"Dear Father Fleming: In some parts of the Old World it is the custom—and a fine custom, when two people part, for each to say to the other: 'Walk with God.'"

"For years you have been the chaplain in the saddest part of all California—San Quentin. Your congregation is not composed of prosperous Christians, but of all races, all nationalities and scores of different religions."

Saturday, July 27.—St. Pantaleon, martyr, during one period of his life was led into a post-boy by a belief in false maxims of the world. Later, however, he was again converted. He distributed all his goods to the poor and shortly thereafter met his death for the Faith.

Administers to Doomed

"You have given of your own strength to men struck down with the prison-madness that so often follows the first hours of captivity. You have smiled at—and prayed for—those who have, in such madness cursed you."

"In the prison hospital men, and women, dying in disgrace, and pitiful failures up to the end, have clung to your hand and, in so doing have gone before a Higher Judge with a light on their faces that any person might envy."

"You have marched before the condemned men up those terrible thirteen steps that lead to the noose, and although the black horror of it all clutched at your very soul your step never has faltered, and your brave and kindly face has been the last thing that man's eyes have rested on as the black cap shut out forever, for him, the light of this world."

"Your faith is not my faith, Father—Your church is not my church. But I have seen you mount those thirteen steps ahead of the man who was about to die. And I know how you, for years, have made the sufferings of thousands—no matter what their creeds, or what their religions have been—your sufferings, and I am not sentimental, and I am not religious, but I think

More Than 200 Girls Attend Summer School At Genesee Institute

Largest Registration in History of the School—Twenty-two Nazareth Academy Girls Are Teachers—Exceptional Interest Is Shown

Two hundred and twenty-four girls have registered for the annual summer school conducted every year at the Genesee Institute under the direction of the manager of the Institute, Frank J. Lyons, a trained welfare worker. The average daily attendance is more than 150. This is the largest registration, and the largest average daily attendance, ever experienced by the school.

Miss Alice Gruessmeyer, a Senior student at Nazareth College, is in charge of the teaching, and assisting her are 22 Nazareth Academy girls, all volunteers for the work. Miss Mary Quinn, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. William T. Nolan, of 46 Normandy Avenue, herself a student at Nazareth Academy, took upon herself the big task of getting the volunteer teachers, the largest number the school has ever had. She did her work with great success.

Classes are held each day from 9 to 11:30 A. M. Cooking, sewing, reading, games and gym work among the subjects taught, and the girls all take an unusual interest in the tasks assigned them. Several beautiful bed quilts have been made, any number of summer dresses, and many articles of clothing remodeled. Miss Anna V. Dolan has charge of the cooking classes, which are held two days a week. The girls are very quick to learn this art, and are most interested in the work.

Donations of dishes, chairs, books, etc., will be gladly received by the Institute, and if generous donors will call Stone 4839 any afternoon or evening and ask for Mr. Lyons he will gladly arrange to call at homes for the donations.

Last year the summer school had only 130 girls registered; the year before, not as many as this. The large registration this year is looked upon as evidence of increased interest in the excellent work of the school, and is in itself a tribute to the capable and faithful management of Frank J. Lyons.

Well Arranged and Attractive

There is no excuse for anyone who plans to build or is building a new home to have other than an attractive house. Designs for modern homes have been brought to a point of excellence where exactly the right number of rooms to meet the family needs and their arrangement can be had in a house that is good to look at and one of which the owner may be proud.

Take, for example, the modified Dutch colonial home shown in the accompanying illustration. Added to this rectangular house are an enclosed veranda, an open terrace and a sun room. These are the exterior of the home, an appearance of size much greater than its dimensions and add to its comfort and attractiveness.

This house is designed for the farm family or a family living in town that requires three fairly large bedrooms. It is 26 feet wide and 22 feet deep, exclusive of the sun room at the end and the terrace at the front. The



foot by 10 feet 6 inches is a breakfast nook where the best formal meals may be served and the work of the homemaker made easier. The kitchen is 8 feet by 11 feet.

Stairs to the basement are under the stairs to the second floor and are reached through the kitchen.

The sun room is a good feature of this house. It is 7 feet 8 inches wide and 21 feet long and has a door leading into it from the terrace as well as the double doors from the living room. There are a window at the front, five windows at the end and two windows at the back which in summer are screened and make the sun room a very attractive semi-indoor sitting room. In the winter these windows are closed, and by extending the heating plant so that this room will be heated it makes a warm, sunny place in the cold weather.

Upstairs there are three bedrooms and a bathroom. All these rooms open off a center hall. Each of the bedrooms is a corner room and each has a good sized closet.

This is a most desirable home building design, and because of its low cost will appeal to a great many prospective home builders who want a pretty house that contains plenty of room for a family of six persons or less and is arranged so that the homemaker can take care of it with a minimum of labor.

home contains six rooms. The living room is 13 feet 6 inches wide and 17 feet 8 inches deep and in the center of the wall which separates it from the sun room is an open fireplace. The sun room is reached through double french doors at the front of the room. An open stairway with one turn leads
