At 10 o'clock Monday morning a pontifical Mass of requiem was celebrated by the Rt. Rev. John Francis O'Hern, D.D., Bishop of Rochester. The church was completely filled with relatives and friends.

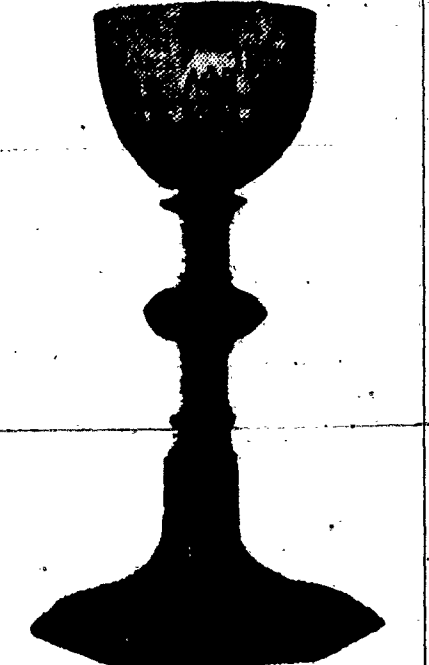

St. Anne's Shrine Annual Pilgrimage To Be Held July 21

The annual Rochester pilgrimage to the shrine of St. Anne de Beausobre at Quebec, Canada, nearly thirty years ago by the late Canon Alphonse A. Notchart will be conducted this year by Rev. Camel A. van der Meulen, successor to Father Notchart as pastor of Our Lady of Victory Church.

The pilgrimage will leave Rochester next Sunday evening, July 21, and more than 100 reservations have been made for it. The itinerary provides for a stop of two days at Quebec, a boat trip up the Saguenay River, visits to St. Joseph's Oratory and to Brother Andre at Montreal. The party will return to Rochester the following Sunday.

The pilgrimage was organized in 1900 by Father Notchart and is regularly planned for July so that the party may attend services at the shrine on the feast of St. Anne, July 26.

At the conclusion of the Mass Bishop O'Hern paid a sincere and affectionate tribute to Father Ruby, his life, his work, character and sacrifices as a priest of God. Burial was made in the priests' plot in Holy Sepulchre Cemetery.

Sketch of His Life Father Ruby was born in Rochester, Sept. 30, 1859. He received his early education at the St. Boniface School and St. Andrew's Seminary. Father Ruby studied for priesthood at St. Joseph's Seminary, Troy, N. Y., and was ordained in the Rochester Cathedral by the late Bishop Bernard McQuaid in June, 1884.

Rev. Father Ruby's first years of ministry were spent in the parish work of the Cathedral and as professor in St. Andrew's Seminary. He later became assistant pastor at Holy Family Church, Auburn. In 1891 he was appointed pastor of Cato and Red Creek, continuing in this charge until 1907, when he was transferred to Wedgport. There he labored until failing health compelled him to retire.

He is survived by three brothers, Peter of Buffalo, Charles and Nicholas of Rochester, and one sister, Miss Helen Ruby of Rochester, and by several nieces and nephews. He was a sincere and faithful priest, well-beloved by his people, and he will be remembered with love and gratitude by many whom he helped in life.
