Nuns To Place Body Of Their Founder In Memorial Chapel Monroe, Mich., Aug. 2.—The Sisters-Servants of the Immaculate Heart of Mary held a simple and dignified ceremony here, today, when they laid to rest the body of the Rev. Louis Florent Gillet, founder of their order, in the new chapel built for that purpose in St. Joseph's Cemetery.

The placing of the body of Father Gillet in the altar of the chapel, built as a memorial to him, culminated nearly four years of effort on the part of the Community Sisters.

An appeal to the French Government through the United States ambassador, the late Myron T. Harlick, and the ambassador from France to the United States, Paul Claudel, brought about, on October 15, 1928, a suspension of the law in favor of the congregation. The body was brought here March 10, 1929, and was given a temporary resting place in the Msgr. John Memorial Chapel in the St. Joseph's cemetery.

He has long labored and saved his own soul and the souls of others during fifteen years of a zealous and devout priesthood.

Interment at Genesee Interment was made in St. Mary's Cemetery, Genesee, N. Y. There, among the people with whom he labored, and whom he loved as his own, he sleeps, awaiting the call of God, in the consecrated ground about which he wrote so beautifully in The Catholic Courier and Journal last week, in an editorial, "Catholic Burial."

"The resting place for the bodies of the departed is blessed and the reasons are all-sufficient. Man is constituted with both a body and a soul. The latter, immortal in its nature, is above the grave. The body, the dwelling place of the soul, is treasured, is sanctified from the moment of the baptismal anointings to the hour of demise, when Extreme Unction was given. With the human body aiding, the soul gave honor and glory to God. In the eyes of the Church, the human body is the temple of the Holy Ghost, the place where Christ had often come. The teaching of the Church is this, that God by His omnipotent power will raise the bodies of the dead, reunite them to the souls and then body and soul will enter into the joy of the Lord forever. It is not to be wondered at then, that Holy Mother Church prescribes consecrated ground as the resting place of the bodies awaiting Resurrection Morn."
