Silver Jubilee Of Rev. F. X. Kunz Is Celebrated

Rector of St. Francis Xavier's Church Honored by People, Priests, and Bishop on Happy Occasion

The Rev. Francis Xavier Kunz, rector of St. Francis Xavier's Church, Bay and Teresa Streets, celebrated the 25th anniversary of his ordination as a priest on Wednesday of this week.

The celebration opened, fittingly, with a jubilee Mass at 10:30 o'clock in his beautifully re-decorated church. The Rt. Rev. John Francis O'Hern, D.D., Bishop of Rochester, and many priests were present.

The church was completely filled with parishioners and friends long before the beginning of the Mass. Bishop O'Hern presided, canon episcopos, Father Kunz celebrated the jubilee Mass with the Rev. George W. Beck as deacon, the Rev. Dr. Andrew E. Broen, sub-deacon, the Rev. Arthur A. Hughes, master of ceremonies, the Rev. Francis Lane, assistant master, the Rev. Herbert J. Staruck, cross bearer, the Rev. Henry Bieler and the Rev. George Weinmann, acolytes. Deacons of honor to the Bishop were the Rev. Charles F. Shay and the Rev. Joseph Solka, C.S.S.R.—About 75 priests were in the sanctuary, coming from all parts of the Diocese, and some from beyond the Diocese.

The sermon was preached by the Rt. Rev. Msgr. Michael Nolan, and he paid sincere tribute to the life, the work and the character of Father Kunz. He was heard with deep appreciation by the large congregation. Bishop O'Hern pronounced the blessing and gave the apostolic benediction at the conclusion of the Mass. Excellent music featured the service, with Mrs. Mary Stockschlaeder at the organ.

Present at the Mass were representatives of the Knights of St. John, the Holy Name Society, the Order of Martha, the Mathias Society, and the Young Ladies Sodality, teaching sisters from St. Francis Xavier convent, and twenty sisters from St. Mary's Hospital.
