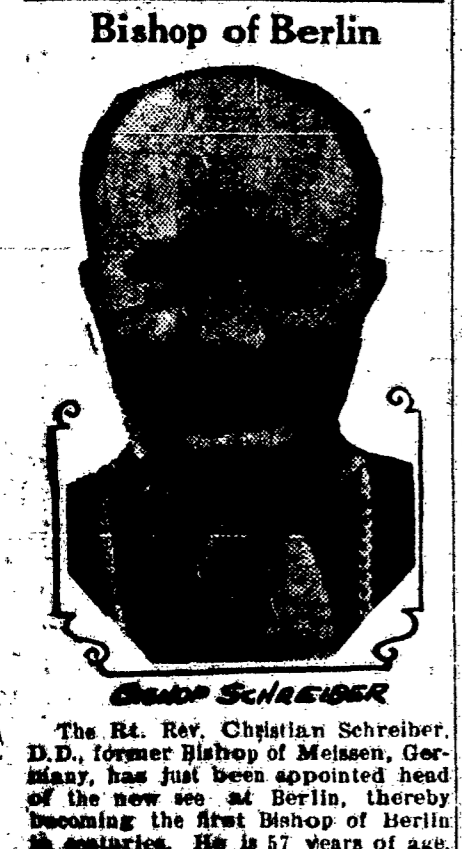

30,000 Catholics March In Great Procession In the City of London

Impressive Event Was the Culmination of Whole Week of Demonstrations in Celebration of 100th Anniversary of Catholic Emancipation

London, Sept. 20.—Last night 30,000 Catholic men marched silently through the streets of London to Westminster Cathedral, and later knelt before Cardinal Bourne in one of the most impressive Roman Catholic demonstrations in England has ever known. It was the culmination of a whole week given over to celebrating the 100th anniversary of the emancipation which restored political and civil rights to Roman Catholics in England.

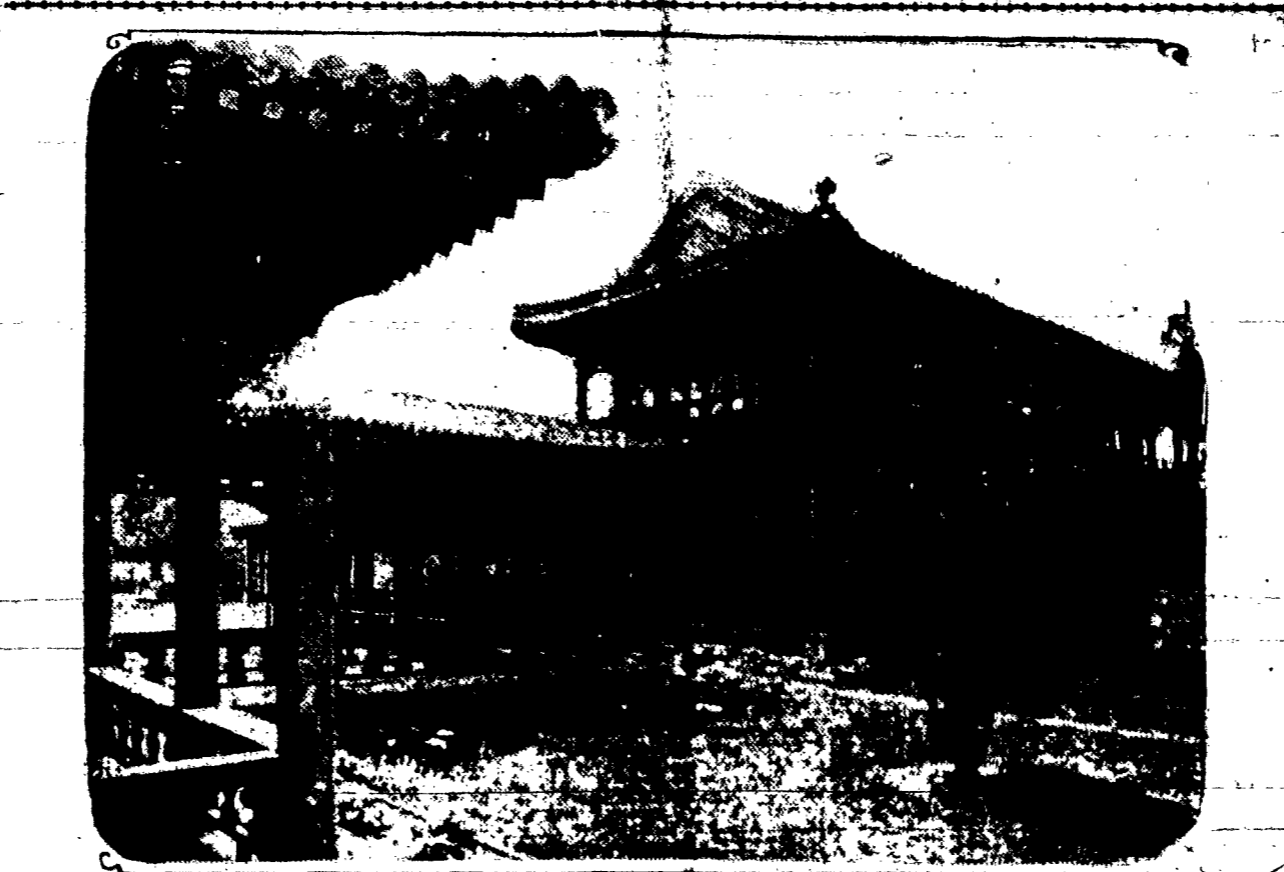
