Cardinal Hayes Dedicates New \$750,000 Church

Tells the People They Have Made a Sanctuary for Their Own Souls
By Erecting This Edifice
New York, Sept. 20.—The new \$750,000 Church of St. Elizabeth, a Norman Gothic granite edifice, erected at the corner of Wadsworth Avenue and 187th Street, this city, was dedicated last Sunday by Cardinal Hayes. Several thousand people attended, and there were many priests and religious present. The Cardinal presided at a solemn high Mass, and at its conclusion he spoke to the people. He said in part:
"Here in this age, frenzied in its desire for the sensual, at a time when evil forces are besieging the very battlements of the church and stoning the rock of St. Peter, instead of your being led away, your face is turned toward the eternal hills. You are not going the way of the flesh and the devil. This church is your argument. Through it your voice will ring out here in our imperial city in this great nation that you believe in God, that you believe in Christ.
"I want you to know that your Archbishop is deeply filled with joy, with gratitude for what you have done for Christ in giving Him such a beautiful tabernacle among men, where He may dwell among you. You have made a sanctuary here for your own soul."

Sunday, September 22.—The Theban Legion were ordered by the Emperor Maximian to turn their swords against the Christian population. They refused to obey his order and were finally massacred, making no resistance although they were fully armed.
Monday, September 23.—St. Thecla, virgin, martyr, is one of the most illustrious as well as one of the most ancient Saints on the Calendar of the Church. Inspired by the preaching of St. Paul at Iconium she spurned the prospect of marriage with a rich and generous man and fled from her home. She was captured and subjected to torture and was several times exposed to death in various forms. Each time she was miraculously saved until at last her Spouse spoke the word and called her to Himself with the double crown of virginity and martyrdom on her head.
Tuesday, September 24.—The Blessed Virgin Mary of Mercy. St. Peter of the noble family of Nolascus was born in Langueadoc about 1180. Early in life he made a vow of chastity and gave his vast property to the Church. Encouraged by a vision of the Blessed Virgin of Arragon he joined with King James of Arragon established the order of Our Lady of Mercy for the redemption of captives. Pope Innocent XII established the feast day in gratitude.
Wednesday, September 25.—St. Plimin, Bishop and Martyr, was a native of Pamplone in Navarre, instituted in the Christian faith by Hozestus, a disciple of St. Saturnin. He preached the Gospel in the remote parts of Gaul, in Agen, Auch, and Beauvais, and set up his residence at Amiens. There he received the crown of martyrdom.

The Rev. Peter J. Hart, New Brunswick; the Rev. Henry Ward, Trenton; the Rev. Thomas A. Roche, Asbury Park; the Rev. William F. Dittich, Atlantic City; the Rev. Maurice B. Erie, Gloucester; and the Rev. Joseph McGrath, Sayreville.

Friday, September 27.—Sts. Cosmas and Damian, martyrs, were born in Arabia and educated in Syria. They became noted for their skill in medicine and practiced their profession without taking fees. Under the persecution of Diocletian they were apprehended and after many tortures were bound hand and foot and cast into the sea.
Saturday, September 28.—St. Wenceslaus, martyr, was the son of a Christian Duke of Bohemia but his mother was a pagan. He was educated in the Faith by his grandmother Ludmilla. His mother attempted to seduce the government when his father died and formed a combination with her second son Dolelaus. Together they persecuted the Christians and fought against Wenceslaus who had managed to retain possession of a large part of the territory. He was murdered treacherously by his brother while praying before the tabernacle at midnight on the Feast of the Angels, A.D. 938.

Archbishop Hanna Issues Statement On Constitution

Washington, D. C., Sept. 20.—In union with the national celebration of Constitution Week, under the auspices of the Committee on American Citizenship of the American Bar Association, the Most Rev. Edward J. Hanna, D.D., Archbishop of San Francisco, and Chairman of the Administrative Committee of the National Catholic Welfare Conference, issued today from the National Headquarters in Washington, D. C., the following statement:
"Our beloved Constitution expresses the principles that have made us and will keep us a great nation. The task placed upon that Constitution was to show how out of many peoples, with varying traditions, we could be one nation, with one national heart and one national soul. The task placed upon that Constitution was to secure for peoples of different religious faith, liberty and security in religious worship and religious rights for all. It is the duty and the privilege of every American to see to it that for him our Constitution is a living ideal to which he endeavors to mold his thought, his soul and his public attitude. It is well to study its origins and its paragraphs; it is better to live its principles and its precepts."
Constitution Week was held this year from September 15th to September 21st.

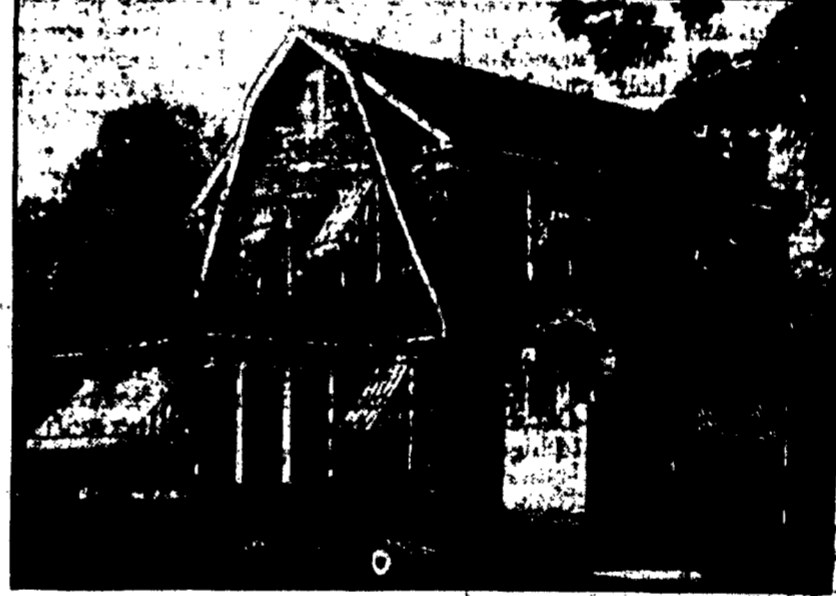

Shingles Give Attractive Touch to Modified Dutch Colonial Home



While this shingled home has an appearance of the Dutch colonial, it will be noticed by the floor plan that it is slightly different. At the front are the living and dining rooms but the central hall is absent. This home contains five rooms and a sun parlor at the end.

One reason for the popularity of the Dutch colonial type of architecture is that it gives an attractive exterior with very little, if any, waste of inside space. The roof lines are broken by dormers which extend the length of the building on both front and back so that the house appears small, but is in reality a two-story home. While the shingled home shown in the accompanying illustration has the appearance of a Dutch colonial, it will be noted by the floor plan that it is slightly different. In the true Dutch colonial the living room usually runs at one end through the depth of the house; the entrance door is in the center and the dining room and kitchen on the opposite side. In this design the standard colonial floor plan has been changed so that the entrance door is at one end and leads directly into the living room which extends



the length of the house rather than the depth. The floor plan which accompanies the exterior view of the five rooms the house contains and the size of each one. It will be noted that the living room is 23 feet long and 11 feet 6 inches wide. At one corner runs the stairs to the second floor. Through a cased opening in the dining room, 11 feet square, and to the right of it is the kitchen, 7 feet 6 inches by 11 feet 6 inches. A fine feature of this home is a sun room, which is 13 feet long by 7 feet 6 inches wide. Almost continuous windows make it a light, airy sitting room. It is connected with the living room by a cased opening and
